STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 6.351.000 bushels, compared with 5,337,000 bushels last year.

PEARS

There were 70,000 bushels of Pears on hand on January 1, 1959.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 5,686,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and

Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 30,718,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of STATISTICS STATISTICS soda totalled 10,694,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 12,716,000 lb. CANADA and last month 11,517,000 lb. The total of all fruit, forzen and in preservatives was 47,098,000 lb. as compared with 37,336,000 lb. last year and 48,836,000 lb. last month.

LIBRARY

VECETABLES Holdings of vegetables were:

BIBLIOTHÈQUE Stocks of potatoes were 14,227,000 hundredweight, as compared with 15,857,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 651,000 bushels as compared with 700,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 684,000 bushels as compared with 405,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage increased to 103,000 bushels from 100,000 bushels last year. There were 29,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at January 1 there were 34,000 crates.

VEGETABLES. FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containtes 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 9,457,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 20,111,000 lb. There were 4,490,000 lb. held "In Brine".

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represents stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of commercial growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
