STOCKS OF FRUIT and VEGETABLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 7,206,000 APPLES bushels, compared with 7,813,000 bushels last year.

PEARS There were 139,000 bushels of Pears on hand on December 1, 1959.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 7,363,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 27,976,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 12,160,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 11,517,000 lb. and last month 11,693,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 47,499,000 lb. as compared with 49,043,000 lb. last year and 45,376,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 13,720,000 hundredweight, as compared with 16,252,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 1,086,000 bushels as compared with 727,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 755,000 bushels as compared with 904,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage increased to 175,000 bushels from 172,000 bushels last year. There were 29,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at December 1 there were 37,000 crates.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 12,261,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 34,904,000 lb. There were 9,067,000 lb. held "In Brine".

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of commercial growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
