## STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

APPLES Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 3,195,000 bushels compared with 2,064,000 bushels last year.

There were 25,000 bushels of Pears on hand on March 1, 1959.

FRUIT. FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 5,253,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over lb. " the total was 25,932,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 10,199,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 10,735,000 lb. and last month 10,168,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 41,384,000 lb. as compared with 32,238,000 lb. last year and 44,301,000 lb. last month.

VEGETARIES Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 9,054,000 hundredweight, as compared with 10,839,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 291,000 bushels as compared with 278,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 253,000 bushels as compared with 160,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 35,000 bushels from 36,000 bushels last year. There were 25,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at March 1 there were 21,000 crates.

#### VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers | lb. and Under" showed a total of 9,163,000 lb. while for "Over | lb." the total was 14,101,000 lb. There were 3,570,000 lb. held "In Brine."

### NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represents stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of commercial growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
