STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 1,178,000 bushels APPLES compared with 532,000 bushels last year.

PEARS

There were 15,000 bushels of Pears on hand on May 1, 1959.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 3,723,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 21,474,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 8,692,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 8,052,000 lb. and last month 8.794.000 lb. The total of all fruit. frozen and in preservatives was 33.889.000 1b. as compared with 27.224.000 lb. last year and 38.325.000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 4.486.000 hundredweight, as compared with 5,866,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 55.000 bushels as compared with 78,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 107,000 bushels as compared with 142,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 27,000 bushels from 32,000 bushels last year. There were 24,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at May 1 there were 14.000 crates.

VECETABLES. FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 7.634,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 12,116,000 lb. There were 3,190,000 lb. held "In Brine".

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represents stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of commercial growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
