STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

APPLES: Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were, 9,714,000 bushels, compared with 8,197,000 bushels last year.

PEARS:

There were 468,000 bushels of Pears on hand on November 1, 1961.

FRUIT. FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES:

There were 7,075,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 33,703,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 10,109,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 9,512,000 lb. and last month 9,-377,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 50,887,000 lb. as compared with 42,323,000 lb. last year and 52,077,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES:

Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 20,624,000 hundredweight, as compared with 18,501,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 1,468,000 bushels as compared with 1,630,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 1,528,000 bushels as compared with 1,014,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage increased to 213,000 bushels from 179,000 bushels last year. There were 68,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at November 1 there were 117,000 crates.

VEGETABLES. FROZEN AND IN BRINE:

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 10,031,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 49,689,000 lb. There were 10,325,000 lb. held "In Brine".

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of commercial growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
