APPLES: Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 3,309,000 bushels, compared with $3,553,000$ bushels last year.

PEARS: There were 35,000 bushels of Pears on hand on February 1, 1961.

## FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES:

There were $4,725,000 \mathrm{lb}$. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb . and Under" while for "Over 1 lb ." the total was $22,102,000 \mathrm{lb}$.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled $9,324,000 \mathrm{lb}$. A year ago they amounted to $11,909,000 \mathrm{lb}$. and last month $9,555,000 \mathrm{lb}$. The cotal of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was $36,151,000$ lb. as compared with $42,798,000 \mathrm{lb}$. last year and $38,940,000 \mathrm{lb}$. last month.

VEGETABLES: Holdings of vegetables were:
Stocks of potatoes were $10,636,000$ hundredweight, as compared with $9,902,000$ hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 916,000 bushels as compared with 647,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 319,000 bushels as compared with 362,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 74,000 bushels from 78,000 bushels last year. There were 29,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at February 1 there were 23,000 crates.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE:
"Containers 1 lb . and Under" showed a total of $11,973,000 \mathrm{lb}$. while for "Over I 1 b ." the total was $32,978,000 \mathrm{lb}$. There were $7,217,000 \mathrm{lb}$. held "In Brine".

## NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of commercial growers in certain areas of comercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
