### STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

APPLES: Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were. 6,076,000 bushels, compared with 4,827,000 bushels last year.

PEARS: 1962.

There were 53,000 bushels of Pears on hand on January 1,

### FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES:

There were 5,258,000 % of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 31,353,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 11,540,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 9,555,000 lb. and last month 11,315,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 48,151,000 lb. as compared with 39,045,000 lb. last year and 50,649,000 lb. last month.

### VEGETABLES Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 1,447,000 hundredweight, as compared with 13,398,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 949,000 bushels as compared with 1,408,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 848,000 bushels as compared with 483,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 101,000 bushels from 104,000 bushels last year. There were 27,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at January 1 there were 28,000 crates.

### VEGETABLES. FROZEN AND IN BRINE:

The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 51,787,-000 lb. compared with 49,383,000 lb. last year. There were 9,023,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 7,855,000 lb. last year.

#### NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservative, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
