STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

ES Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 11,194,000 compared with 9,714,000 bushels last year. bus

There were 9,231,000 lb. of fruit "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 30,307,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 11,550,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 10,391,000 lb. and last month 9,851,000 lb. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 51,088,000 1b. as compared with 51.167,000 lb. last year and 50.939,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES: Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 22,112,000 hundredweight, as compared with 22,792,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 2.057.000 bushels as compared with 1.468.000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 1,539,000 bushels as compared with 1,528,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage increased to 217,000 bushels from 213,000 bushels last year. There were 122,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at November 1 there were 68,000 crates.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE:

The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 74,939,000 lb. as compared with 59,873,000 lb. last year. There were 9,802,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 10,275,000 lb. last year.

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
