## STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

APPLES:
Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 2,874,000 bushels, compared with 2,153,000 bushels last year.

PEARS: There were 25,000 bushels of Pears on hand on March 1, 1962.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES:
There were $4,560,000 \mathrm{lb}$. of frult MContainers 1 lb . and Under" while for "Over 1 lb ." the total wesph, $127,000 \mathrm{lb}$.

The stocks of fruit in surphur dioxdde or in benzoate of soda totalled $10,276,000 \mathrm{lb}$. A year ago they amounted to $9,367,000 \mathrm{lb}$. and last month $11,530,000 \mathrm{lb}$. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was $40,963,000 \mathrm{lb}$. as compared with $34,966,000 \mathrm{lb}$. last year and $44,858,000 \mathrm{lb}$. last month.

## VECEDBLAS: Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were $10,539,000$ hundredweight, as compared with 9,272,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 297,000 bushels as compared with 504,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 267,000 bushels as compared with 156,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 58,000 bushels from 68,000 bushels last year. There were 24,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at March 1 there were 29,000 crates.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE:
The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to $46,091,000 \mathrm{lb}$. compared with $40,311,000 \mathrm{lb}$ 。 last year. There were 7,$359,000 \mathrm{lb}$. of vegetables held in brine as against $6,709,000 \mathrm{lb}$. last year.

## NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables: fresh, frozen and in preservative, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
