STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

APPLES: Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 1,710,000 bushels, compared with 1,276,000 bushels last year.

PEARS: 1962.

There were 25,000 bushels of Pears on hand on April 1,

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES:

There were 3,701,000 lb. of fruit "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 23.081,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 9,735,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 8,329,000 lb. and last month 10,234,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 36,517,000 lb. as compared with 31,753,000 lb. last year and 40,794,000 lb. last month.

VECETABLES: Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 7,458,000 hundredweight, as compared with 7,385,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 116,000 bushels as compared with 290,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 99,000 bushels as compared with 82,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 36,000 bushels from 62,000 bushels last year. There were 23,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at April 1 there were 27,000 crates.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE:

The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 39,-699,000 lb. compared with 36,094,000 lb. last year. There were 6,549,-000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 6,094,000 lb. last year.

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
