STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

APPLES: Danadian apples held in cold and common storage were 382,000 bushels, compared with 275,000 bushels last year.

PEARS:

There were 5,000 bushels of Pears on hand on June 1, 1962.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES:

There were 2,707,000 lb. of fruit "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 20,078,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 8,427,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 6,167,000 lb. and last month 8,835,000 lb. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 31,212,000 lb. as compared with 23,386,000 lb. last year and 33,045,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES:

Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 1,951,000 hundredweight, as compared with 3,240,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 59,000 bushels as compared with 68,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 120,000 bushels as compared with 50,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage increased to 41,000 bushels from 37,000 bushels last year. There were 18,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at June 1 there were 20,000 crates.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE:

The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 30,266,000 lb. as compared with 26,978,000 lb. last year. There were 5,509,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 4,988,000 lb. last year.

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
