RIBL STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES Depai APPLES: Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 10,173,000

bushels, compared with 9,020,000 bushels last year.

PEARS: There were 168,000 bushels of pears on hand on December 1, 1963.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES:

There were 8,465,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" as against 29,524,000 lb. in "Containers Over 1 lb."

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 11,945,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 12,452,000 lb. and last month 11,110,000 lb. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 49,934,000 lb. as compared with 53,912,000 lb. last year and 52,285,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES: Stocks of potatoes were 21,220,000 hundredweight, as compared with 20,255,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 1,885,000 bushels as compared with 1,648,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 1,530,000 bushels as compared with 1,493,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage increased to 209,000 bushels from 186,000 bushels last year. There were 46,000 crates of celery on hand at December 1, 1969, as compared with 50,000 crates last year.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE:

The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 70,791,000 lb. as compared with 72,429,000 lb. last year. There were 7,320,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 8,818,000 lb. last year.

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
