APPLES: Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 4,767,000 bushels, compared with 4,222,000 bushels last year.

PEARS: There were 63,000 bushels of Pears on hand on February 1, 1963.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES:

There were 6,893,000 lb. of fruit "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 24,997,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 11,634,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 11,467,000 lb. and last month 12,683,000 lb. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 43,524,000 lb. as compared with 44,819,000 lb. last year and 46,430,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 12,779,000 hundredweight, as compared with 15,065,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 740,000 bushels as compared with 514,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 563,000 bushels as compared with 522,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 64,000 bushels from 71,000 bushels last year. There were 24,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at February 1 there were 21,000 crates.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE:

The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 65,258,000 lb. as compared with 47,926,000 lb. last year. There were 7,104,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 7,947,000 lb. last year.

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
