STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 5,381,000 Inshels, compared with 4,767,000 bushels last year.

FEARS: There were 38,000 bushels of pears on hand on February 1, 1964.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES:

There were 6,099,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" as against 24,148,000 lb. in "Containers Over 1 lb."

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 14,855,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 12,056,000 lb. and last month 14,700,000 lb. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 45,102,000 lb. as compared with 45,104,000 lb. last year and 46,913,000 lb. last month.

<u>VEGETABLES</u>: Stocks of potatoes were 14,783,000 hundredweight, as compared with 14,156,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 1,128,000 bushels as compared with 740,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 539,000 bushels as compared with 563,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage increased to 99,000 bushels from 64,000 bushels last year. There were 34,000 crates of celery on hand at February 1, 1964, as compared with 24,000 crates last year.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE:

The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 57,978,000 lb. as compared with 62,740,000 lb. last year. There were 6,812,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 7,104,000 lb. last year.

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
