#### STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

APPLES: Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 1,853,000 bushels, compared with 1,770,000 bushels last year.

PEARS:

There were 21,000 bushels of pears on hand on April 1, 1964.

#### FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES:

There were 4,389,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" as against 22,054,000 lb. in "Containers Over 1 lb."

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 11,173,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 9,686,000 lb. and last month 13,674,000 lb. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 37,616,000 1b. as compared with 35,058,000 lb. last year and 41,801,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES: Stocks of potatoes were 9,739,000 hundredweight, as compared with 8,969,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 399,000 bushels as compared with 235,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 271,000 bushels as compared with 139,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage increased to 61,000 bushels from 43,000 bushels last year. There were 24,000 crates of celery on hand at April 1, 1964, as compared with 25,000 crates last year.

#### VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE:

The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 47,096,000 lb. as compared with 48,027,000 lb. last year. There were 5,629,000 lb. of wegetables held in brine as against 5,338,000 lb. last year. STATISTICS STATISTICANADA

### NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables (fresh, frozen and in preservatives), held by food processors, celd storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of groupes in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
