### STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

APTILES: Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 539,000 bushels, compared with 365,000 bushels last year.

PEARS: There were 25,000 bushels of pears on hand on June 1, 1964.

#### FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES:

There were 2,656,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" as against 16,315,000 lb. in "Containers Over 1 lb."

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 9,601,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 7,516,000 lb. and last month 10,512,000 lb. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 28,572,000 lb. as compared with 26,754,000 lb. last year and 32,514,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES: Stocks of potatoes were 2,206,000 hundredweight, as compared with 3,128,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 67,000 bushels as compared with 89,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 79,000 bushels as compared with 60,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage increased to 47,000 bushels from 40,000 bushels last year. There were 22,000 crates of celery on hand at June 1, 1964, as compared with 25,000 crates last year.

#### VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE:

The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 36,371,000 lb. as compared with 34,872,000 lb. last year. There were 4,081,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 3,966,000 lb. last year.

### NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables (fresh, frozen and in preservatives), held by food processors, cold storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
