## STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

APPLES: Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were $3,667,000$ bushels, compared with $3,141,000$ bushels last year.

PEARS: There were 26,000 bushels of pears on hand on March 1, 1966 .
FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES:
There were 4,495,000 lbo of fruit in "Containers 1 lb 。 and Under" as against 29,360,000 1b, in "Containers Over 1 lb."

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled $11,964,0001 \mathrm{~b}$. A year ago they amounted to $13,364,0001 \mathrm{~b}$. and last month 12,732,000 1b. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was $45,819,0001 \mathrm{~b}$. as compared with $48,742,000 \mathrm{lb}$. last year and $49,059,000 \mathrm{lb}$. last month.

VEGETABLES: Stocks of potatoes were $9,970,000$ hundredweight, as compared with $11,241,000$ hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 754,000 bushels as compared with 428,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 116,000 bushels as compared with 230,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 47,000 bushels from 49,000 bushels last year. There were 20,000 crates of celery on hand at March 1,1966 , as compared with 21,000 crates last year.
VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE:
The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 62,303,000 1 b . as compared with $61,003,0001 \mathrm{~b}$. last year. There were $5,424,0001 \mathrm{~b}$. of vegetables held in brine as against 6,399,000 lb. last year.

## NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables (fresh, frozen and in preservatives), held by food processors, cold storages, frult warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
