STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

APPLES: Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 5,854,000 bushels, compared with 4,941,000 bushels last year.

PEARS: There were 106,000 bushels of pears on hand at February 1, 1967.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES:

There were 8,197,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under", as against 35,554,000 lb. in "Containers Over 1 lb.".

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 12,210,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 12,732,000 lb. and last month 12,289,000 lb. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 55,961,000 lb. as compared with 49,209,000 lb. last year and 57,681,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES: Stocks of potatoes were 20,012,000 hundredweight, as compared with 15,372,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 597,000 bushels as compared with 1,364,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 722,000 bushels as compared with 403,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 57,000 bushels from 66,000 bushels last year. There were 19,000 crates of celery on hand at February 1, 1967, as compared with 19,000 crates last year.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE:

The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 59,725,000 lb. as compared with 67,267,000 lb. last year. There were 12,707,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 5,938,000 lb. last year.

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables (fresh, frozen and in preservatives) held by food processors, cold storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
