STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

APPLES: Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 2,613,000 bushels compared with 2,415,000 bushels last year.

PEARS: There were 50,000 bushels of pears on hand at April 1, 1967.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES:

There were 6,318,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under", as against 30,168,000 lb. in "Containers Over 1 lb.".

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide, etc. totalled 10,235,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 10,400,000 lb. and last month 11,038,000 lb. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 46,721,000 lb. as compared with 40,541,000 lb. last year and 51,669,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES: Stocks of potatoes were 13,277,000 hundredweight, as compared with 8,793,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 176,000 bushels as compared with 455,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 170,000 bushels as compared with 77,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage increased to 43,000 bushels from 41,000 bushels last year. There were 21,000 crates of celery on hand at April 1, 1967, as compared with 20,000 crates last year.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE:

The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 47,190,000 lb. as compared with 50,546,000 lb. last year. Current holdings of frozen vegetables intended for re-manufacture amounted to 6,745,000 lb. There were 11,401,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 5,139,000 lb. last year.

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables (fresh, frozen and in preservatives) held by food processors, cold storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
