STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

NOVEMBER 1968

Apples. — Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 10,980,000 bushels compared with 12,582,000 bushels last year.

Pears. - There were 467,000 bushels of pears on hand at November 1, 1968.

Fruit, frozen and preservatives. - There were 9,059,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb and Under", as against 33,061,000 lb. in "Containers over 1 lb."

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide, etc. totalled 6,112,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 9,010,000 lb. and last month 6,057,000 lb. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 48,232,000 lb. as compared with 54,183,000 lb. last year and 52,029,000 lb. last month.

Vegetables. — Stocks of potatoes were 28,051,000 hundredweight, as compared with 29,313,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 3,221,000 bushels as compared with 1,803,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 2,337,000 bushels as compared with 1,560,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage increased to 242,000 bushels from 156,000 bushels last year.

Vegetables, frozen and in brine. — The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 98,530,000 lb. as compared with 82,902,000 lb. last year. Current holdings of frozen vegetables intended for re-manufacture amounted to 12,060,000 lb. There were 11,626,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 15,452,000 lb. last year.

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represents stocks of fruit and vegetables (fresh, frozen and in preservatives) held by food processors, cold storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canadian Department of Agriculture.
