STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 5,944,000 bushels APPLES: compared with 5,854,000 bushels last year.

PEARS: There were 42,000 bushels of pears on hand at February 1, 1968.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES:

There were 6,912,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under", as against 32,103,000 lb. in "Containers Over 1 lb.".

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide, etc. totalled 9,487,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 11,845,000 1b. and last month 9,844,000 1b. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 48,502,000 lb. as compared with 55,199,000 lb. last year and 51,465,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES: Stocks of potatoes were 16,254,000 hundredweight, as compared with 22,868,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 952,000 bushels as compared with 596,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 221,000 bushels as compared with 722,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 49,000 bushels from 57,000 bushels last year. The inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture ceased to collect monthly inventories of celery as of November 1, 1967.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE:

The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 69,597,000 lb. as compared with 61,201,000 lb. last year. Current holdings of frozen vegetables intended for re-manufacture amounted to 7,641,000 lb. There were 13,671,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 12,707,000 lb. last year.

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables (fresh, frozen and in preservatives) held by food processors, cold storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canadian Department of Agriculture.
