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STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

MAY 1968

Apples. — Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 1,226,000 bushels compared with 1,611,000 bushels last year.

Pears. - There were 51,000 bushels of pears on hand at May 1, 1968.

Fruit, frozen and in preservatives. - There were 4,374,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under", as against 21,586,000 lb. in "Containers Over 1 lb.".

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide, etc. totalled 7,582,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 9,694,000 lb. and last month 8,159,000 lb. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 33,542,000 lb. as compared with 41,763,000 lb. last year and 39,049,000 lb. last month.

<u>Vegetables.</u> — Stocks of potatoes were 5,678,000 hundredweight, as compared with 12,421,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 43,000 bushels as compared with 73,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 61,000 bushels as compared with 104,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 26,000 bushels from 41,000 bushels last year. The inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture ceased to collect monthly inventories of celery as of November 1, 1967.

Vegetables, frozen and in brine. — The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 45,334,000 lb. as compared with 41,007,000 lb. last year. Current holdings of frozen vegetables intended for re-manufacture amounted to 4,240,000 lb. There were 11,070,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 10,575,000 lb. last year.

## NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables (fresh, frozen and in preservatives) held by food processors, cold storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canadian Department of Agriculture.
