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STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

AUGUST 1969

Stocks of apples, pears, potatoes, onions, carrots and cabbage will not be reported for the period July to October inclusive.

Fruit, frozen and in preservatives

There were 7,302,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" as against 36,555,000 lb. in "Containers over 1 lb."

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide, etc., totalled 5,430,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 6,498,000 lb. and last month to 5,704,000 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives, was 49,287,000 lb. as compared with 48,940,000 lb. last year and 36,244,000 lb. last month.

Vegetables, frozen and in brine

The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 62,564,000 lb. as compared with 59,462,000 lb. last year. Current holdings of frozen vegetables intended for re-manufacture amounted to 10,539,000 lb. There were 6,690,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 8,212,000 lb. last year.
