STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

April 1970

Apples. - Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 153,000,000 lb. compared with 132,424,000 lb. last year.

Pears. - There were 2,024,000 lb. of pears on hand at April 1, 1970.

Fruit, frozen and in preservatives. — There were 4,625,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under", as against 32,311,000 lb. in "Containers over 1 lb."

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide, etc. totalled 7,446,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 6,662,000 lb. and last month 8,234,000 lb. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 44,382,000 lb. as compared with 35,754,000 lb. last year and 47,677,000 lb. last month.

Vegetables. — Stocks of potatoes were 10,671,000 hundredweight, as compared with 14,597,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 11,099,000 lb. as compared with 27,650,000 lb. last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 14,386,000 lb. as compared with 18,500,000 lb. last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 1,045,000 lb. from 1,155,000 lb. last year.

Vegetables, frozen and in brine. — The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 62,755,000 lb. as compared with 71,429,000 lb. last year. Current holdings of frozen vegetables intended for re-manufacture amounted to 10,249,000 lb. There were 9,818,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 10,508,000 lb. last year.

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represents stocks of fruit and vegetables (fresh, frozen and in preservatives) held by food processors, cold storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canadian Department of Agriculture.
