STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

JANUARY 1, 1972

Apples. — Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 350,463,000 lb. compared with 378,019,000 lb. last year.

Pears. - There were 4,410,000 lb. of pears on hand at January 1, 1972.

Fruit, frozen and in preservatives. — There were 5,170,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under", as against 34,627,000 lb. in "Containers over 1 lb.".

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide, etc. totalled 8,438,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 9,454,000 lb. and last month 7,697,000 lb. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 48,235,000 lb. as compared with 51,555,000 lb. last year and 54,235,000 lb. last month.

Vegetables. — Stocks of potatoes were 25,618,000 hundredweight, as compared with 27,365,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 89,188,000 lb. as compared with 87,118,000 lb. last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 71,445,000 lb. as compared with 88,057,000 lb. last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 5,859,000 lb. from 7,140,000 lb. last year.

Vegetables, frozen and in brine. — The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 96,595,000 lb. as compared with 99,585,000 lb. last year. Current holdings of frozen vegetables intended for re-manufacture amounted to 14,959,000 lb. There were 8,048,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 11,113,000 lb. last year.

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represents stocks of fruit and vegetables (fresh, frozen and in preservatives) held by food processors, cold storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canadian Department of Agriculture.
