STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

NOVEMBER 1, 1972

Apples. - Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 467,883,000 lb. compared with 495,904,000 lb. last year.

Pears. - There were 18,625,000 lb. of pears on hand at November 1, 1972.

Fruit, frozen and in preservatives. - There were 4,974,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under", as against 37,803,000 lb. in "Containers over 1 lb.".

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide, etc. totalled 6,999,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 6,346,000 lb. and last month 7,051,000 lb. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 49,776,000 lb. as compared with 50,428,000 lb. last year and 51,007,000 lb. last month.

<u>Vegetables</u>. - Stocks of potatoes were 24,764,000 hundredweight, as compared with 32,091,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 75,501,000 lb. as compared with 114,200,000 lb. last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 126,029,000 lb. as compared with 110,954,000 lb. last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 13,334,000 lb. from 22,342,000 lb. last year.

Vegetables, frozen and in brime. - The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 104,125,000 lb. as compared with 105,112,000 lb. last year. Current holdings of frozen vegetables intended for re-manufacture amounted to 14,928,000 lb. There were 9,360,000 lb. of vegetables held in brime as against 10,522,000 lb. last year.

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represents stocks of fruit and vegetables (fresh, frozen and in preservatives) held by food processors, cold storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canadian Department of Agriculture.
