

STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

FEBRUARY 1, 1973

Apples. - Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 248,023,000 lb. compared with 275,345,000 lb. last year.

Pears. - There were 2,545,000 lb. of pears on hand at February 1, 1973.

Fruit, frozen and in preservatives. - There were 3,713,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under", as against 31,418,000 lb. in "Containers over 1 lb.".

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide, etc. totalled 10,058,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 8,334,000 lb. and last month 10,079,000 lb. The total of all fruit frozen and in preservatives was 45,189,000 lb. as compared with 48,723,000 lb. last year and 46,666,000 lb. last month.

<u>Vegetables</u>. - Stocks of potatoes were 15,141,000 hundredweight, as compared with 22,389,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 44,954,000 lb. as compared with 75,964,000 lb. last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 65,011,000 lb. as compared with 48,957,000 lb. last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 2,577,000 lb. from 3,311,000 lb. last year.

Vegetables, frozen and in brine. - The total stocks of frozen vegetables amounted to 73,279,000 lb. as compared with 75,002,000 lb. last year. Current holdings of frozen vegetables intended for re-manufacture amounted to 9,175,000 lb. There were 6,658,000 lb. of vegetables held in brine as against 8,011,000 lb. last year.

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represents stocks of fruit and vegetables (fresh, frozen and in preservatives) held by food processors, cold storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canadian Department of Agriculture.
