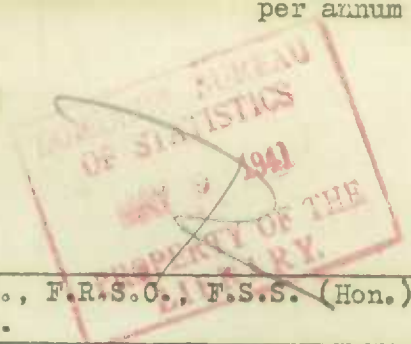

PRELIMINARY REPORT ON THE STOCKS OF CANNED FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

ON HAND, APRIL, 1st, 1941.

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics presents herewith a preliminary report on the stocks of canned fruits and vegetables on hand on April 1st, 1941. The statistics in the table below include the stocks held by canners, wholesale dealers and chain store warehouses. A more detailed and final report will be published later when all returns are in. Firms not yet reporting for April had about 125,000 dozen tins of canned fruits and vegetables on hand on January 1, 1941. These firms will be included in the final report. The figures for April 1, 1941, are preliminary and, therefore, subject to revision.

The method of reporting was changed on January 1, 1941, from CASES to DOZEN CANS. This was done to accommodate the growing number of canners who keep their inventory records in dozen cans. Care must, therefore, be taken in making comparisons with figures for previous periods.

Dozen cans may be converted to cases on the following basis which give approximately correct results.

Canned apples 6 cans to the case
 All other canned fruits and vegetables 24 cans to the case
