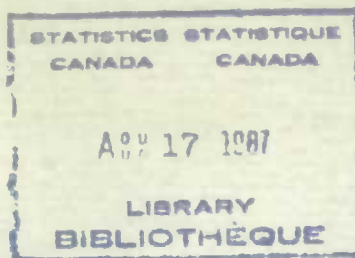

COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF MEAT AND FISH, OCTOBER 1, 1937.

This report is a summary of meat, fish and poultry stocks held in Cold Storage in Canada by provinces and principal cities as at October 1, 1937. For comparative purposes the figures of October 1, 1936 and September 1, 1937 are also shown.

PORK

Total pork stocks reported amounted to 20,769,844 lb. of which 4,041,207 lb. were fresh frozen, 2,661,405 lb., fresh not frozen and 14,067,232 lb. cured or in cure. Combining these figures with an estimate of 1,472,814 lb. for firms failing to report, a grand total of 22,242,658 lb. is shown. This total is approximately 5.9 million lb. or 21.1 per cent less than those reported at October 1, 1936 and approximately 3.2 million lb. or 12.6 per cent less than those reported at September 1, 1937.

LARD

Reported stocks of pure lard in Storage amounted to 1,166,125 lb. On the addition of an estimate of 53,417 lb. for firms which failed to report, a grand total of 1,219,542 lb. is shown. This figure shows a decrease of approximately 983 thousand lb. or 44.6 per cent less than that reported at October 1, 1936 and a decrease of approximately 529 thousand lb. or 30.3 per cent less than that reported at the first of the previous month.

BEEF

The compilation of reported beef stocks shows a total of 17,043,248 lb. 8,899,979 lb. being fresh frozen, 7,498,394 lb. fresh not frozen, 235,021 lb. cured beef and 409,854 lb. in process of cure. Adding to this an estimate of 403,366 lb. for firms failing to report, a grand total of 17,446,614 lb. is shown. Comparing these figures with those of October 1, 1936, there is an increase of approximately 930 thousand lb. or 5.6 per cent and with those of September 1, 1937, there is an increase of approximately 5.5 million lb. or 45.5 per cent.

VEAL

Veal holdings were reported at 4,359,531 lb. 3,184,213 lb. being fresh frozen and 1,175,318 lb. being fresh not frozen. Adding to this an estimate of 133,822 lb. for firms failing to report a grand total of 4,493,353 lb. is shown. These figures show a decrease of approximately 109 thousand lb. or 2.4 per cent in comparison with those reported at October 1, 1936 and an increase of approximately 1 million lb. or 29.8 per cent with those of September 1, 1937.

MUTTON AND LAMB

The reported holdings of mutton and lamb amounted to 1,583,250 lb. of which 1,011,218 lb. were fresh frozen and 572,032 lb. fresh not frozen. On the addition of an estimate of 43,602 lb. for firms failing to report a grand total of 1,626,852 lb. is shown. In comparison with October 1, 1936 a decrease of approximately 140 thousand lb. or 7.9 per cent is shown and with those of September 1, 1937, an increase of approximately 850 thousand lb. or 109.5 per cent is shown.

POULTRY

Reported stocks of poultry amounted to 3,341,075 lb. These figures represent a decrease of approximately 650 thousand lb. or 16.4 per cent less than those reported at October 1, 1936 and a decrease of approximately 623 thousand lb. or 15.7 per cent under those reported at September 1, 1937.

FISH

Fresh frozen fish reported at October 1, 1937 amounted to 25,224,725 lb. added to which is an estimate of 343,703 lb. making a grand total of 25,568,428 lb. This total is approximately 883 thousand lb. or 3.6 per cent greater than those reported for the same month last year and approximately 500 thousand lb. or 2.0 per cent greater than those reported at September 1, 1937.

Stocks of smoked, dried, pickled and salted fish reported at October 1, 1937 amounted to 6,228,606 lb. Compared with stocks reported at October 1, 1936 a decrease of approximately 115 thousand lb. or 1.8 per cent is shown and compared with the total at the first of the previous month, there is a decrease of approximately 327 thousand lb. or 5.0 per cent.

Fish frozen during the month of September 1937 amounted to 4,638,082 lb. representing an increase of approximately 910 thousand lb. or 24.4 per cent as compared with the quantity frozen during the month of September 1936 and a decrease of approximately 2.7 million lb. or 37.1 per cent in comparison with the quantity frozen during the month of August 1937.

SUBJECT: Report on the progress of the work of the Bureau of Agricultural Mechanization during the first quarter of 1954.

The Bureau of Agricultural Mechanization has been organized since 1946 to develop and disseminate modern agricultural machinery and equipment to the farmers of the Philippines. During the first quarter of 1954, the Bureau has been actively engaged in the following activities:

1. Development of new agricultural machinery and equipment. The Bureau has been working on the design and development of a new type of rice harrow, which is more efficient and less costly than the existing models. It has also been working on the development of a new type of rice transplanter, which is more suitable for the conditions of the Philippine rice fields.

2. Dissemination of agricultural machinery and equipment. The Bureau has been actively engaged in the dissemination of agricultural machinery and equipment to the farmers of the Philippines. It has been holding numerous demonstrations and exhibitions, and has been distributing a large number of leaflets and brochures on the use of agricultural machinery and equipment.

3. Training of farmers in the use of agricultural machinery and equipment. The Bureau has been holding numerous training courses for farmers in the use of agricultural machinery and equipment.
