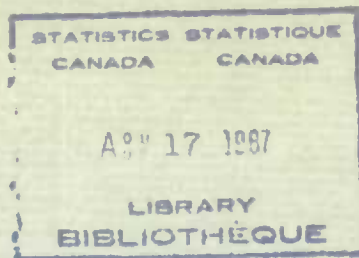

COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF MEAT AND FISH, JULY 2, 1937.

This report is a consensus of meat, fish and poultry stocks held in cold storage in Canada by provinces and principal cities as at July 2, 1937 (July 1 being a holiday). For comparative purposes the figures of July 2, 1936 and June 1, 1937 are also shown.

Total pork stocks reported at July 2, 1937 amounted to 45,145,211 pounds of which 22,071,041 pounds were fresh frozen, 5,894,722 pounds, fresh not frozen and 19,179,448 pounds cured or in cure. An estimate of 5,630 pounds for firms which failed to report brings the grand total to 45,150,841 pounds which is approximately 8 million pounds or 21.9 per cent more than was reported on July 2, 1936 and approximately 6 million pounds or 12 per cent less than was reported at the first of the previous month.

Reported stocks of pure lard in storage amounted to 2,765,135 pounds. On the addition of an estimate of 4,323 pounds for firms failing to report, a grand total of 2,769,458 pounds is shown. In comparison with stocks in storage at July 2, 1936, there is a decrease of approximately 525 thousand pounds or 16 per cent and an increase of approximately 150 thousand pounds or 5.7 per cent over those reported at June 1, 1937.

Total beef stocks as reported amounted to 10,001,440 pounds, 4,098,905 pounds being fresh frozen, 5,531,737 pounds being fresh not frozen, 183,089 pounds cured beef and 187,709 pounds in process of cure. Comparing these figures with those of July 2, 1936, there is a decrease of approximately 2.8 million pounds or 22.1 per cent and a decrease of approximately 1.5 million pounds or 13 per cent under those reported at June 1, 1937.

Holdings of veal were reported at 2,862,642 pounds, 1,925,075 pounds being fresh frozen and 937,567 pounds being fresh, not frozen. These figures show a decrease of approximately 300 thousand pounds or 9.6 per cent under those reported at July 2, 1936 and an increase of approximately 210 thousand pounds or 8 per cent over those reported at June 1, 1937.

The reported holdings of mutton and lamb amounted to 957,008 pounds, 700,234 pounds of which were fresh frozen and 256,774 fresh not frozen. The grand total including estimated stocks of 1,343 pounds amounted to 958,351 pounds, an increase of approximately 280 thousand pounds or 41.7 per cent over the stocks reported at the same date of the previous year and a decrease of approximately 1 million pounds or 49.5 per cent less than the stocks reported at the first of June 1937.

Poultry stocks as reported amounted to 5,939,336 pounds. These figures represent an increase of approximately 1.3 million pounds or 28.3 per cent over the quantity reported at the same date last year and a decrease of 1 million pounds or 13.7 per cent less than the figures for the previous month.

Fresh frozen fish reported at July 2, 1937 amounted to 18,166,182 pounds, added to which is an estimate of 150,825 pounds, making a grand total of 18,327,007 pounds. Compared with the stocks reported at July 2 of the previous year it shows an increase of approximately 3.9 million pounds or 26.7 per cent, and compared with the total at the first of the previous month an increase of about 4.1 million pounds or 29.1 per cent.

Stocks of smoked, dried, pickled and salted fish reported at July 2, 1937 amounted to 5,144,711 pounds, which combined with an estimate of 47,600 pounds makes a grand total of 5,192,311 pounds. When comparisons are made with stocks reported at July 2, 1936, these figures represent an increase of about 230 thousand pounds or 4.7 per cent and compared with the total reported at June 1, 1937, an increase of approximately 800 thousand pounds or 18 per cent.

Fish frozen during the month of June, 1937 amounted to 5,739,258 pounds, representing an increase of approximately 1 million pounds or 20.4 per cent as compared with the quantity frozen during the month of June, 1936 and an increase of approximately 3.1 million pounds or 119.0 per cent in comparison with the quantities frozen during the month of May, 1937.

Out of a total of 195 firms 14 failed to send in their returns in time for the figures to be included in this statement.
