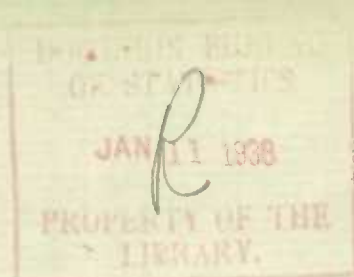

COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF MEAT AND FISH, JANUARY 1, 1938.

Total storage stocks of meat on January 1, 1938 were 68,493,736 lb. compared with 85,253,760 lb. on the same date last year and 70,513,847 lb. at the first of the previous month.

PORK

Total pork stocks reported amounted to 36,078,975 lb. of which 3,563,558 lb. were fresh, 15,369,774 lb. frozen and 17,145,643 lb. cured or in cure. Combining these figures with an estimate of 135,092 lb. for firms failing to report, a grand total of 36,214,067 lb. is shown. This total is approximately 13.4 million lb. or 27.0 per cent less than that reported at January 1, 1937 and approximately 3.6 million lb. or 10.9 per cent greater than that reported at December 1, 1937.

LARD

Reported stocks of pure lard in storage amounted to 2,283,618 lb. On the addition of an estimate of 15,000 lb. for firms which failed to report, a grand total of 2,298,618 lb. is shown. This figure shows a decrease of approximately 33.8 thousand lb. or 1.5 per cent less than that reported at January 1, 1937 and an increase of approximately 637 thousand lb. or 38.4 per cent greater than that reported at the first of the previous month.

BEEF

The compilation of reported beef stocks shows a total of 22,477,643 lb. of which 5,021,401 lb. were fresh, 17,014,990 lb. frozen and 441,252 lb. cured or in cure. Adding to this an estimate of 147,709 lb. for firms failing to report, a grand total of 22,625,352 lb. is shown. Comparing these figures with those of January 1, 1937, there is a decrease of approximately 1.3 million lb. or 5.5 per cent and with those of December 1, 1937, there is a decrease of approximately 6 million lb. or 21.1 per cent.

VEAL

Veal holdings were reported at 2,871,322 lb. of which 473,337 lb. were fresh and 2,397,985 lb. frozen. On the addition of an estimate of 14,630 lb. for firms failing to report, a grand total of 2,885,952 lb. is shown. These figures show a decrease of approximately 1.6 million lb. or 35.9 per cent in comparison with those reported at January 1, 1937 and a decrease of approximately 1.3 million lb. or 30.6 per cent with those of December 1, 1937.

MUTTON AND LAMB

The reported holdings of mutton and lamb amounted to 4,750,799 lb. of which 717,595 lb. were fresh and 4,033,204 lb. frozen. On combining these figures with an estimate of 13,809 lb. for firms failing to report, a grand total of 4,764,608 lb. is shown. These figures show a decrease of approximately 2.4 million lb. or 33.8 per cent less than those reported at January 1, 1937 and a decrease of approximately 282 thousand lb. or 5.6 per cent with those reported at the first of the previous month.

POULTRY

Reported stocks of poultry amounted to 10,361,754 lb. Comparing this figure with that of January 1, 1937, there is a decrease of approximately 6.5 million lb. or 38.4 per cent and with that of December 1, 1937 there is an increase of approximately 4.2 million lb. or 68.7 per cent.

FISH

Fresh and frozen fish reported at January 1, 1938 amounted to 24,325,936 lb. Adding to this an estimate of 1,150,397 lb. for firms failing to report, a grand total of 25,476,333 lb. is shown. This total is approximately 3 million lb. or 13.2 per cent greater than that reported on the same date last year and approximately 2.7 million lb. or 9.7 per cent less than that reported at December 1, 1937.

Stocks of smoked, dried, pickled and salted fish reported at January 1, 1938, amounted to 5,455,944 lb. Combining this total with an estimate of 5,843 lb. for firms failing to report, there is a grand total of 5,461,787 lb. Comparing this figure with stocks reported at the first of January, 1937, there is a decrease of approximately 400 thousand lb. or 6.9 per cent and with December 1, 1937, there is a decrease of approximately 47 thousand lb. or 0.9 per cent.

Fish frozen during the month of December, 1937 amounted to 4,496,140 lb. representing an increase of approximately 1.5 million lb. or 47.8 per cent as compared with the quantity frozen during the month of December, 1936 and a decrease of approximately 215 thousand lb. or 4.6 per cent in comparison with the quantity frozen during the month of November, 1937.

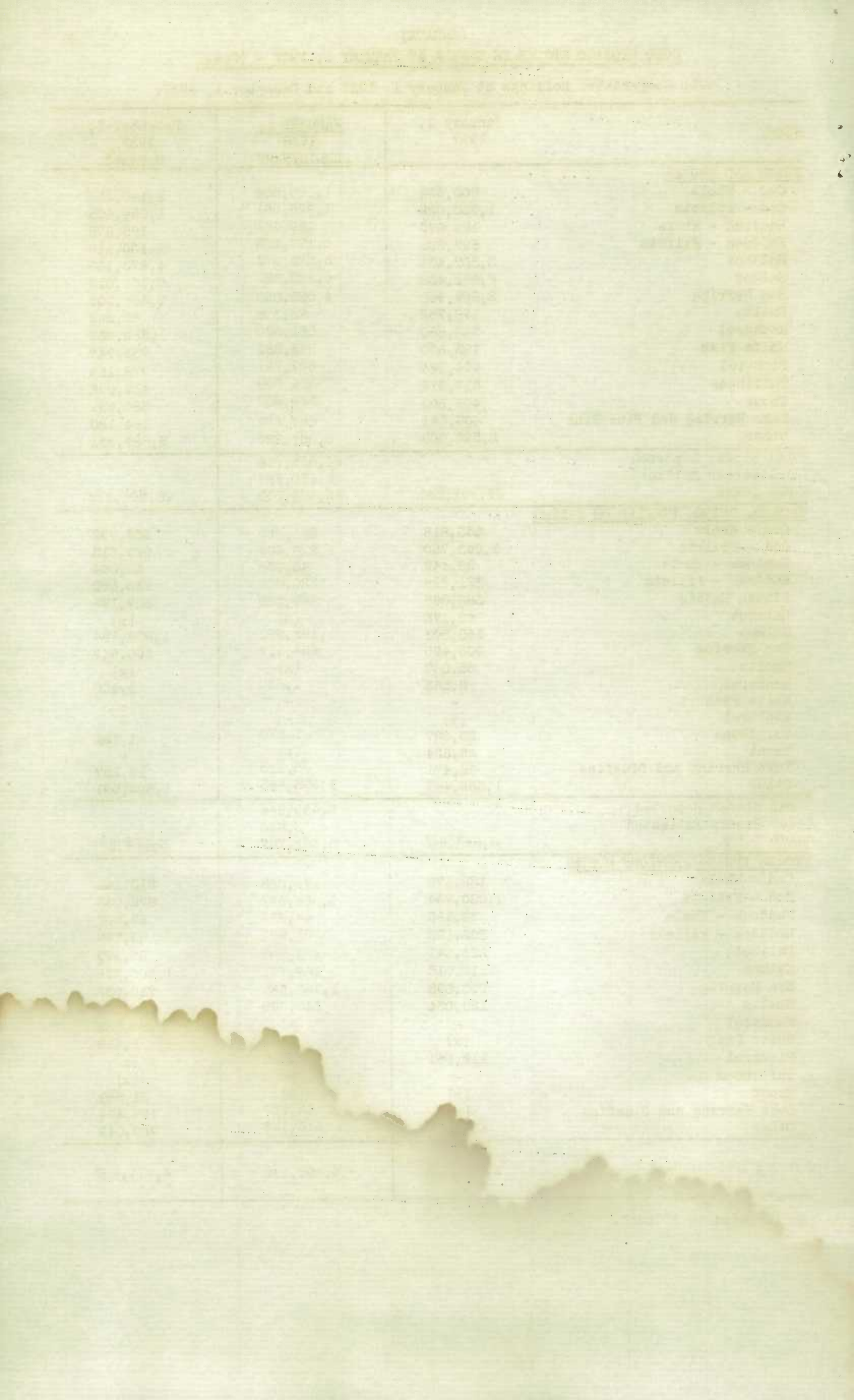

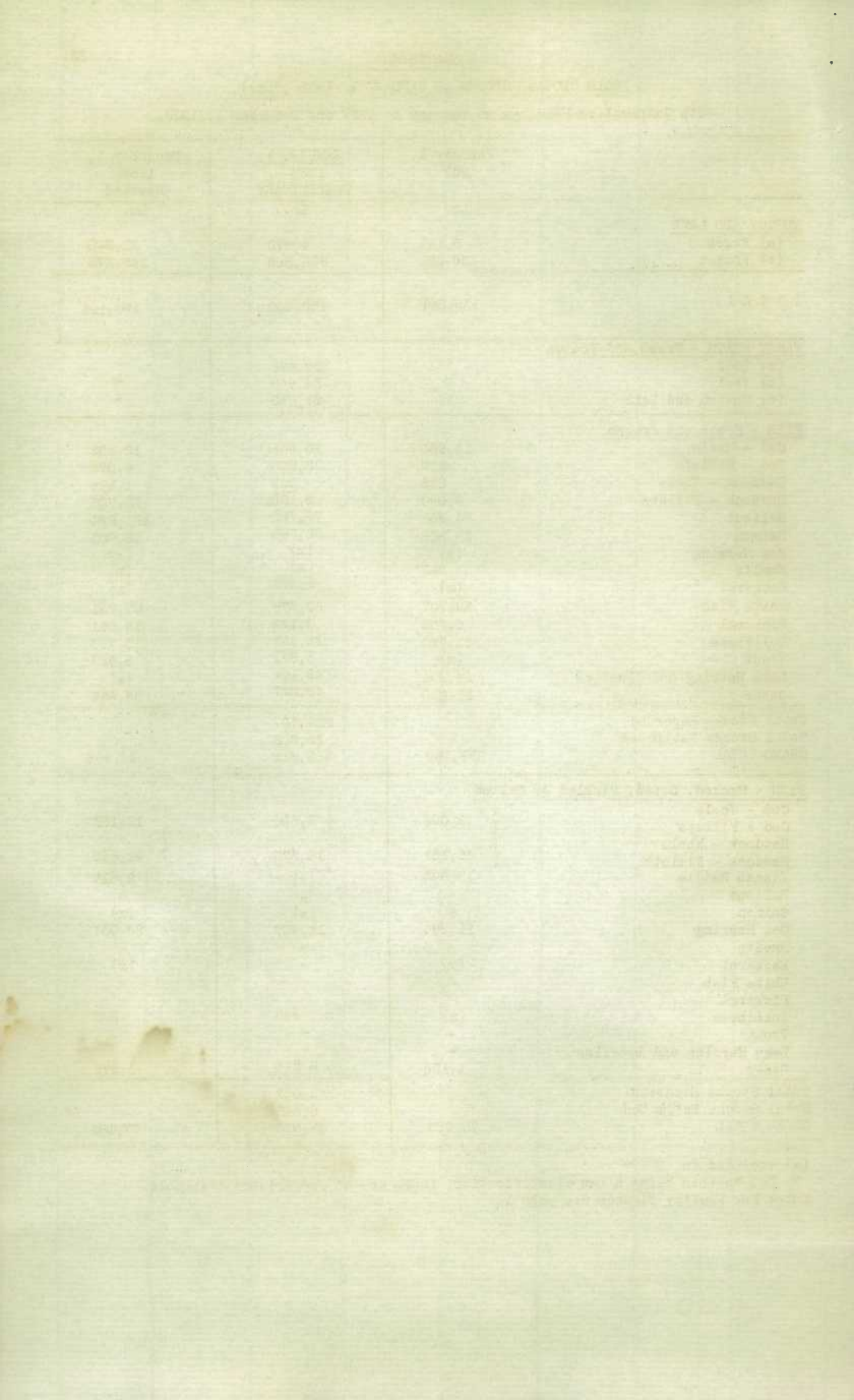
