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COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF MEAT AND LARD, NOVEMBER 1, 1939

ALL MEAT.

Storage stocks of all meat on November 1, 1939 were 76,153,342 lb. This total shows an increase of 24.9 million lb. as compared with the total on hand a year ago and during the past month there was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 25.3 million lb.

PORK

Pork holdings of all varieties amounted to 39,574,026 lb. This total is divided into three classifications as follows: Fresh 5,990,379 lb.; Frozen 13,050,569 lb. and Cured and In Cure 20,533,078 lb. An estimate of 101,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time brought the Grand Total to 39,675,026 lb. In comparison with the stocks at October 1, 1939, an increase is noted, representing a net "Into-Storage" movement of 12 million lb. Last year there was a similar movement of only 4.4 million lb.

LARD

The reported holdings of lard amounted to 2,479,854 lb. Adding to this an estimate of 51,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time, a Grand Total of 2,530,854 lb. was shown. During October, there was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 906 thousand lb. while last year there was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 320 thousand lb.

BEEF

Storage holdings of beef were reported as 25,746,128 lb. of which 8,391,410 lb. were Fresh; 14,458,302 lb. were Frozen; 380,594 lb. were Cured and In Cure and 2,515,812 lb. were Fancy Meats. There was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 9.1 million lb. during October while for the same period a year ago there was a similar movement of 4.6 million lb. The Grand Total stocks this month are 54.8 per cent greater than last month.

VEAL

Veal storage showed reports totalling 5,096,384 lb. of which 1,026,133 lb. were Fresh; 3,647,849 lb. were Frozen and 322,402 lb. were Fancy Meats. A net "Into-Storage" movement of 542 thousand lb. during October was noted while last year there was a similar movement of 632 thousand lb. The Grand Total stocks this month were 11.9 per cent greater than last month.

MUTTON AND LAMB

Storage of mutton and lamb showed a reported total of 5,736,804 lb. of which 610,376 lb. were Fresh; 4,904,860 lb. were Frozen and 221,568 lb. were Fancy Meats. A net "Into-Storage" movement during October amounted to 3.7 million lb. while last year a similar movement amounted to 2.9 million lb. The Grand Total stocks this month are 187.9 per cent greater than last month.

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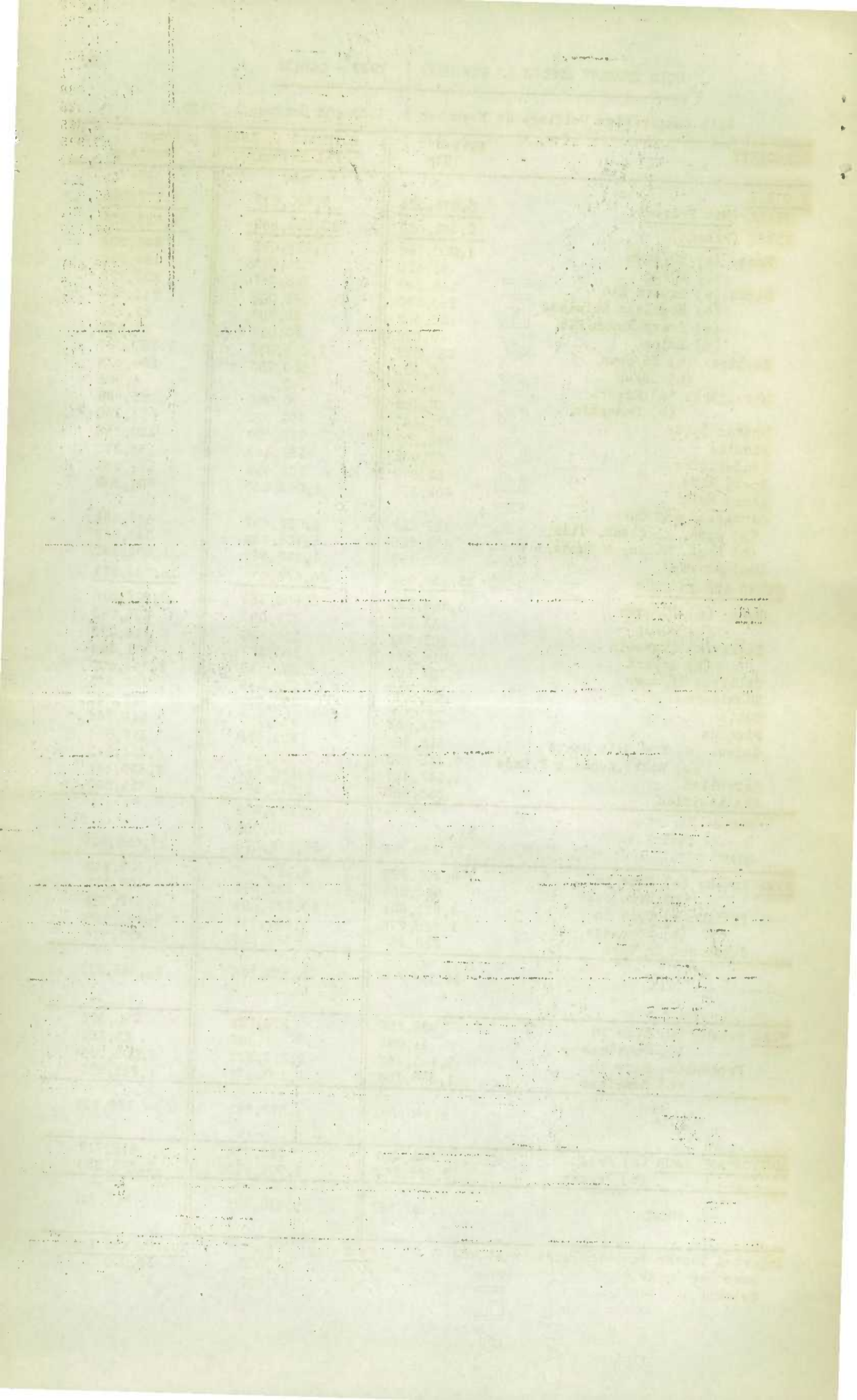
