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COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF MEAT AND LARD, MAY 1, 1939

ALL MEAT.

Storage stocks of all meats on May 1, 1939 were 53,158,995 lb. There was a large decrease as compared with the stocks reported on the same day last year when there were 63,623,178 lb., and a small decrease as compared with the stocks at the first of last month when there were 53,373,780 lb.

PORK.

Pork holdings at May 1, 1939 are shown as 36,013,313 lb. This total is divided into three classes as follows: Fresh 4,345,778 lb.; Frozen 15,984,675 lb. and Cured and In Cure 15,682,860 lb. Adding to the total an estimate of 260,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time there is a Grand Total of 36,273,313 lb. In comparison with the stocks reported at the first of the previous month there is an increase of 5.1 per cent being a net "Into-Storage" movement of 1.8 million lb. Last year there was a similar movement of 2.4 million lb.

LARD.

Firms reporting lard gave figures totalling 3,096,421 lb. Combining this figure with an estimate of 51,000 lb. for firms failing to report, a Grand Total of 3,147,421 lb. is shown. A net "Into-Storage" movement of 536 thousand lb. during April is noted while last year there was a similar movement of 547 thousand lb.

BEEF.

The reports of beef stocks record a total of 12,719,557 lb. of which 5,106,779 lb. were Fresh; 4,690,783 lb. were Frozen; 425,507 lb. Cured and In Cure and 2,496,488 lb. Fancy Meats. An estimate for firms failing to report brings the Grand Total to 12,754,557 lb. There was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.6 million lb. while during the same period last year the net movement was also "Out-of-Storage" being 2.0 million lb. The Grand Total stocks this month are 11.2 per cent less than last month.

VEAL.

Holdings of veal were reported at 2,517,769 lb. of which 1,147,614 lb. were Fresh; 1,165,851 lb. were Frozen and 204,304 lb. were Fancy Meats. With an estimate of 4,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time the Grand Total is 2,521,769 lb. Comparatively, this total figure shows an increase of 352 thousand lb. over that of May 1, 1938. There was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 779 thousand lb. while last year there was a similar movement of 939 thousand lb. The Grand Total Stocks this month are 44.7 per cent greater than last month.

MUTTON AND LAMB.

Storage of mutton and lamb showed a reported total of 1,908,356 lb. of which 162,098 lb. were Fresh; 1,675,836 lb. were Frozen and 70,422 lb. were Fancy Meats. Combining the reported total with an estimate of 4,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time there is a Grand Total of 1,912,356 lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement during April amounted to 828 thousand lb. while last year a similar movement amounted to 1.1 million lb. The Grand Total Stocks this month are 30.2 per cent less than last month.
