

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COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF MEAT AND LARD, JULY 1, 1939

ALL MEAT.

Storage stocks of all meats on July 1, 1939 were 50,185,951 lb. There was an increase as compared with the total reported on the same day last year when there were 48,733,626 lb., while in comparison with the previous month, a decrease is noted, the stocks at that date being 54,109,319 lb.

PORK.

Pork holdings at July 1, 1939 are shown as 32,446,688 lb. This total is classified as follows:

Fresh 3,311,637 lb., Frozen 13,514,977 lb. and Cured and In Cure 15,620,074 lb.

Combining the reported total with an estimate of 125,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time, a Grand Total of 32,571,688 lb. is shown. In comparison with the stocks reported at the first of June, a decrease of 9.5 per cent is noted representing a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 3.4 million lb. Last year there was a similar movement of 6.2 million lb.

LARD.

Firms reporting lard gave figures totalling 3,850,941 lb. On the addition of an estimate of 18,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time, there was a Grand Total of 3,868,941 lb. A net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 48 thousand lb. during June is noted, while last year the net movement was "Into-Storage" at 715 thousand lb.

BEEF.

The reports of beef stocks recorded a total of 12,832,956 lb. of which 6,392,114 lb. were Fresh; 3,469,828 lb. were Frozen; 526,281 lb. were Cured and In Cure and 2,444,733 lb. were Fancy Meats. An estimate of 35,000 lb. for late firms brought the Grand Total to 12,867,956 lb. There was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 672 thousand lb. while during the same period a year ago, there was a similar movement of 1.4 million lb. The Grand Total Stocks this month were 5.0 per cent less than last month.

VEAL.

Veal storage showed reports of 4,001,410 lb. of which 1,060,404 lb. were Fresh; 2,613,927 lb. were Frozen and 327,079 lb. were Fancy Meats. There was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 555 thousand lb. while last year there was a similar movement of 201 thousand lb. The Grand Total Stocks this month were 16.1 per cent greater than last month.

MUTTON AND LAMB.

Storage of mutton and lamb showed a reported total of 904,897 lb. of which 322,585 lb. were Fresh; 518,115 lb. were Frozen and 64,197 lb. were Fancy Meats. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement during June amounted to 244 thousand lb. while last year a similar movement amounted to 124 thousand lb. The Grand Total Stocks this month were 21.2 per cent less than last month.

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
