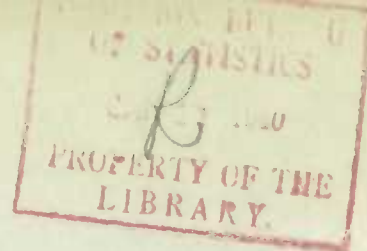

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COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF MEAT AND LARD, JANUARY 1, 1940

ALL MEAT.

Storage stocks of all meat on January 1, 1940 were 82,889,123 lb. This total shows an increase of 26.8 million lb. as compared with the total on hand a year ago and during December, 1939 there was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 4.9 million lb.

PORK.

Pork holdings of all varieties amounted to 43,453,517 lb. This total is divided into three classifications as follows: Fresh 4,535,745 lb.; Frozen 16,019,482 lb. and Cured and in Cure 22,898,290 lb. An estimate of 707,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time brought the Grand Total to 44,160,517 lb. In comparison with the stocks reported on December 1, 1939, a decrease is noted, representing a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 3.2 million lb. Last year there was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 2 million lb.

LARD.

The reported holdings of lard amounted to 4,031,172 lb. Adding to this an estimate of 99,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time, a Grand Total of 4,130,172 lb. was shown. During December there was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 1.1 million lb. while last year there was a similar movement of 900 thousand lb.

BEEF.

Storage holdings of beef were reported as 28,937,017 lb. of which 6,308,216 lb. were Fresh; 19,316,534 lb. were Frozen; 485,331 lb. were Cured and In Cure and 2,826,936 lb. were Fancy Meats. Combining the reported total with an estimate of 633,000 lb. for late firms, there was a Grand Total of 29,570,017 lb. There was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 570 thousand lb. during December, 1939 while for the same period a year ago there was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.9 million lb. The Grand Total stocks this month were 2.0 per cent greater than last month.

VEAL.

Veal storage showed reports totalling 4,168,411 lb. of which 579,730 lb. were Fresh; 3,280,368 lb. were Frozen and 308,313 lb. were Fancy Meats. A net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 712 thousand lb. during December, 1939 was noted while last year there was a similar movement of 1 million lb. The Total stocks this month were 14.6 per cent less than last month.

MUTTON AND LAMB.

Storage of mutton and lamb showed a reported total of 6,330,178 lb. of which 343,303 lb. were Fresh; 5,824,328 lb. were Frozen and 162,547 lb. were Fancy Meats. A net "Out-of-Storage" movement during December, 1939 amounted to 174 thousand lb. while last year a similar movement amounted to 83 thousand lb. The Total stocks this month were 2.7 per cent less than last month.

FOR THE YEAR 1904

THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT
AND THE LANDS OF THE UNITED STATES

CHAPTER I

The Bureau of Land Management is one of the most important of the departments of the Interior. It is charged with the duty of managing the public lands of the United States, and of seeing that they are properly disposed of for the benefit of the Nation.

CHAPTER II

The Bureau of Land Management is organized into several divisions, each of which is charged with a specific duty. The divisions are: the Surveying Division, the Land Office, the Mineral Lands Division, and the Reclamation Division. Each division is headed by a Chief, who is assisted by several assistants.

CHAPTER III

The Surveying Division is charged with the duty of surveying the public lands of the United States. It is organized into several districts, each of which is headed by a District Surveyor. The District Surveyors are assisted by several assistants.

CHAPTER IV

The Land Office is charged with the duty of managing the public lands of the United States. It is organized into several districts, each of which is headed by a District Land Officer. The District Land Officers are assisted by several assistants.

CHAPTER V

The Mineral Lands Division is charged with the duty of managing the mineral lands of the United States. It is organized into several districts, each of which is headed by a District Mineral Lands Officer. The District Mineral Lands Officers are assisted by several assistants.

CHAPTER VI

The Reclamation Division is charged with the duty of managing the reclamation lands of the United States. It is organized into several districts, each of which is headed by a District Reclamation Officer. The District Reclamation Officers are assisted by several assistants.
