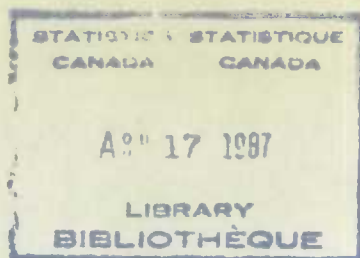

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COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF MEAT AND LARD, DECEMBER 1, 1940

ALL MEAT.

The Grand Total stocks of all Canadian and Imported meat were 82,519,783 lb.

The reported stocks of Canadian meat amounted to 74,761,153 lb. With an addition of 6,916,000 lb. of estimated for firms failing to report on time, there was a total of 81,677,153 lb. There was a decrease of 6.1 million lb. from the total Canadian meat stocks of a year ago, while during November 1940 there was a net "Into-Storage" Movement of 14.1 million lb.

PORK

The reported holdings of Canadian pork were 46,681,528 lb. consisting of Fresh 6,276,717 lb; Frozen 13,213,722 lb; and Cured 27,191,089 lb. There was also an estimate of 5,125,000 lb. for late firms, which brought the Grand Total of Canadian pork to 51,806,528 lb. There was an apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of 9.4 million lb. as compared with a similar movement of 7.7 million lb. last year.

There were additional reported holdings of Imported Pork amounting to 698,226 lb.

LARD

The reported holdings amounted to 2,699,245 lb. With an estimate of 100,000 lb. for late firms the total 2,792,245 lb. was 212 thousand lb. less than last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement was 518 thousand lb. Last year there was a similar movement of 479 thousand lb.

BEEF

The stocks of Canadian beef were reported as 18,016,801 lb. These consisted of 7,790,918 lb. Fresh; 8,686,903 lb. Frozen; 201,502 lb. Cured; and 1,337,478 lb. Fancy Meats. With an estimate of 951,000 lb. for firms failing to report in time, there was a Grand Total of 18,967,802 lb. These stocks are 16.5 per cent more than last month and show an apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of 2.7 million lb. compared with an "Into-Storage" movement of 3.2 million lb. a year ago. The holdings this year are 10.0 million lb. less than last year.

In addition to the Canadian Stocks there were reports of Imported Beef totalling 69,658 lb.

VEAL

These stocks totalled 4,817,163 lb. as reported, being Fresh 750,457 lb. Frozen 3,679,695 lb; and Fancy Meats 387,011 lb. Adding an estimate of 365 thousand lb. for late firms, the Grand Total amounted to 5,182,163 lb. They are 3.1 per cent more than those of last month, there having been an apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of 156 thousand lb. during November 1940, while last year there was an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 121 thousand lb.

MUTTON AND LAMB

The holdings of Canadian as reported totalled 5,245,661 lb. consisting of Fresh 449,800 lb; Frozen 4,546,259 lb; and Fancy Meats 249,602 lb. The Grand Total was 5,720,661 lb. when 475,000 lb. were added as an estimate for firms failing to report on time. The apparent net additions during November were 1.9 million lb. as compared with a net storage increase of 766 thousand lb. during November 1939.

There were reported stocks in addition of Imported mutton and lamb amounting to 74,746 lb.
