

COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF MEAT AND LARD, FEBRUARY 1, 1940.

ALL MEAT.

Storage stocks of all meat on February 1, 1940 were 82,013,814 lb. This total shows an increase of 26 million lb., as compared with the total on hand a year ago, and during January 1940, there was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 2 million lb.

PORK.

Pork holdings of all varieties amounted to 44,558,632 lb. This total is divided into three classifications as follows: Fresh 6,491,295 lb.; Frozen 18,646,392 lb. and Cured and In Cure 19,420,945 lb. An estimate of 542,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time brought the Grand Total to 45,100,632 lb. In comparison with the stocks reported on January 1, 1940, an increase was noted, representing a net "Into-Storage" movement of 1 million lb. Last year there was a similar movement of 2.1 million lb.

LARD.

The reported holdings of lard amounted to 3,291,154 lb. Adding to this an estimate of 26,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time, a Grand Total of 3,317,154 lb. was shown. During January there was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 790 thousand lb. while last year there was a similar movement of 506 thousand lb.

BEEF.

Storage holdings of beef were reported as 28,852,415 lb., of which 7,793,078 lb. were Fresh; 17,368,353 lb. were Frozen; 575,965 lb. were Cured and In Cure and 3,115,019 lb. were Fancy Meats. Combining the reported total with an estimate of 40,000 lb. for late firms, there was a Grand Total of 28,892,415 lb. There was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 544 thousand lb. during January, 1940 while for the same period a year ago, there was an "Into-Storage" movement of 21 thousand lb. The Grand Total Stocks this month are 1.9 per cent less than last month.


VEAL.

Veal storage showed reports totalling 2,912,644 lb. of which 644,359 lb. were Fresh; 2,032,254 lb. were Frozen and 236,031 lb. were Fancy Meats. A net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.3 million lb. for the month was noted while last year for the same period there was a similar movement of 1.1 million lb. The Grand Total Stocks this month are 3.1 per cent less than last month.

MUTTON AND LAMB.

Storage of mutton and lamb showed a reported total of 5,690,123 lb., of which 415,506 lb. were Fresh: 5,116,434 lb. were Frozen and 158,183 lb. were Fancy Meats. Adding to the reported total an estimate of 3,500 lb. for late firms the Grand Total was brought to 5,693,623 lb. A net "Out-of-Storage" movement during January, 1940 amounted to 648 thousand lb. while last year a similar movement amounted to 1.1 million lb. The Grand Total Stocks this month are 10.2 per cent less than last month.


