

COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF MEAT AND LARD, MARCH 1, 1940.

ALL MEAT.

Storage stocks of all meat on March 1, 1940 were 88,742,760 lb. This total shows an increase of 35.9 million lb., as compared with the total on hand a year ago, and during February 1940, there was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 6.1 million lb.

PORK.

Pork holdings of all varieties as reported amounted to 55,254,015 lb. This total is divided into three classifications as follows: rresh 4,861,180 lb.; Frozen 26,578,876 lb. and Cured and In Cure 23,813,959 lb. An estimate of 1,275,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time brought the Grand Total to 56,529,015 lb. In comparison with the stocks reported on February 1, 1940 an increase was noted, representing a net "Into-Storage" movement of 11,4 million lb. Last year there was a similar movement of 2.2 million lb.

LARD.

The reported holdings of lard amounted to 3,686,095 lb. Adding to this an estimate of 125,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time, a Grand Total of 3,809,095 lb. was shown. During February there was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 497 thousand lb. while last year there was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of one thousand lb.

BEEF.

Storage holdings of beef were reported as 24,842,319 lb. of which 5,707,229 lb. were Fresh; 15,850,019 lb. were Frozen; 514,076 lb. were Cured and In Cure and 2,770,995 lb. were Fancy Meats. Combining the reported total with an estimate of 452,000 lb. for late firms, there was a Grand Total of 25,294,319 lb. There was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 3.6 million lb. during February 1940 while for the same period a year ago, there was a similar movement of 3.5 million lb. The Grand Total stocks this month are 12,5 per cent less than last month.

VEAL.

Veal storage showed reports totalling 1,970,168 lb. of which 523,645 lb. were Fresh; 1,275,423 lb. were Frozen and 171,100 lb. were Fancy Meats. On the addition of an estimate of 54,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time, there is a Grand Total of 2,024,168 lb. A net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 892 thousand lb. for the month was noted while last year for the same period there was a like movement of 977 thousand lb. The Grand Total Stocks this month are 30.6 per cent less than last month.


MUTTON AND LAMB.

Storage of mutton and lamb showed a reported total of 4,820,258 lb. of which 281,219 lb. were Fresh; 4,416,422 lb. were Frozen, and 122,617 lb. were Fancy Meats. Adding to the reported total an estimate of 75,000 lb. for late firms the Grand Total was brought to 4,895,258 lb. A net "Out-of-Storage" movement during February 1940 amounted to 799 thousand lb. while last year a similar movement amounted to 979 thousand lb. The Grand Total Stocks this month are 14.0 per cent less than last month.


