



COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF MEAT AND LARD, APRIL 1, 1940.

ALL MEAT. Storage stocks of all meat on April 1, 1940 were 92,199,762 lb. This total shows an increase of 38,4 million lb., as compared with the total on hand a year ago, During March 1940 there was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 1.7 million lb.

PORK. Pork holdings of all varieties amounted to 60,833,571 lb. This total is divided into three classifications as follows: Fresh 4,432,515 lb; Frozen 37,263,672 lb. and Cured and In Cure 19,137,384 lb. An estimate of 150,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time brought the Grand Total to 60,983,571 lb. In comparison with the stocks reported on March 1, 1940, an increase was noted, representing a net "Into-Storage" movement of 3.0 million lb. Last year there was a similar movement of 3.3 million lb.

LARD. The reported holdings of lard amounted to 3,731,285 lb. Adding to this an estimate of 90,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time, a Grand Total of 3,821,285 lb. was shown. During March there was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 1,578 lb. while last year there was a similar movement of 540 thousand lb.

Storage holdings of beef were reported as 25,080,894 lb. of which 6,707,659 lb. were Fresh; 14,900,644 lb. were Frozen; 737,390 lb. were Cured and In Cure and 2,743,201 lb. were Fancy Meats. Combining the reported total with an estimate of 400,000 lb. for late firms, there was a Grand Total of 25,438,894 lb. There was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 27,672 lb. during March 1940 while for the same period a year ago there was a similar movement of 1.3 million lb. The Grand Total stocks this month are 0.1 per cent less than last month.

VEAL.

Veal storage showed reports totalling 1,594,270 lb. of which 631,992 lb.

were Fresh; 809,398 lb. were Frozen and 152,880 lb. were Fancy Meats.

On the addition of an estimate of 25,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time, there was a Grand Total of 1,619,270 lb. A net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 415 thousand lb. for the month was noted while last year for the same period there was a similar movement of 364 thousand lb. The Grand Total stocks this month are 20.4 per cent less than last month.

MUTTON AND LAMB.

Storage of mutton and lamb showed a reported total of 4,088,027 lb. of which 210,639 lb. were Fresh; 3,760,919 lb. were Frozen and 116,469 lb. were Fancy Meats. Adding to the reported total an estimate of 20,000 lb. for late firms, the Grand Total was brought to 4,108,027 lb. A net "Out-of-Storage" movement during March 1940 amounted to 788 thousand lb. while last year a similar movement amounted to 632 thousand lb. The Grand Total stocks this month are 16.1 per cent less than last month.

N.B. The Annual Summary of Cold Storage Reports showing final figures of stocks on the first of each month of 1939 was issued on April 2, 1940.
