ALL MEAT

The Grand Total stocks of all Canadian and Imported meat were 111,451,820 lb. as compared with 87,545,445 lb. at the same date last year.

The reported stocks of Canadian meat amounted to 92,011,478 lb. With an addition of 18,247,000 lb. of estimates for firms failing to report on time, there was a total of 110,258,478 lb. There was an increase of 23.8 million lb. over the total Canadian meat stocks of a year ago, while during November 1941 there was a net "Into-Storage" movement of 18.5 million lb.

PORK

The reported holdings of Canadian pork were 50,360,820 lb. consisting of Fresh 5,230,031 lb; Frozen 18,941,359 lb; and Cured 26,189,430 lb. There was also an estimate of 9,198,000 lb. for late firms, which brought the Grand Total of Canadian pork to 59,558,820 lb. There was an apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of 8.3 million lb. as compared with a similar movement of 10.7 million lb. last year.

There were additional reported holdings of Imported Pork amounting to 371,566 lb.

LARD

The reported holdings amounted to 4,736,129 lb. Including an estimate of 847,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time, the Grand Total amounted to 5,583,129 lb. which were 2.6 million lb. greater than last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement was 2.2 million lb. Last year there was a similar movement of 706,000 lb.

BEEF

The stocks of Canadian beef were reported as 28,544,936 lb. These consisted of 8,110,148 lb. Fresh; 17,086,415 lb. Frozen; 1,028,020 lb. Cured; and 2,320,353 lb. Fancy Meats. With an estimate of 7,018,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time, there was a Grand Total of 35,562,936 lb. These stocks are 31.6 per cent greater than last month and show an apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of 8.5 million lb. compared with a similar movement of 5.9 million lb. a year ago. The holdings this year are 13.4 million lb. greater than last year.

In addition to the Canadian stocks there were reported holdings of Imported Beef totalling 275,761 lb.

VEAL

These stocks totalled 7,073,554 lb. as reported, being Fresh 1,036,084 lb.; Frozen 5,543,666 lb; and Fancy Meats 493,804 lb. Adding an estimate of 714,000 lb. for late firms, the Grand Total amounted to 7,787,554 lb. They are 5.3 per cent greater than those of last month, there having been an apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of 394,000 lb. during November 1941 while last year there was a similar movement of 298,000 lb.

MUTTON AND LAMB

The holdings of Canadian mutton and lamb as reported totalled 6,032,168 lb., consisting of Fresh 449,678 lb; Frozen 5,329,553 lb. and Fancy Meats 252,937 lb. The Grand Total was 7,349,168 lb. when 1,317,000 lb. were added as an estimate for firms failing to report on time.

The apparent net increase during November was 1.3 million lb. as compared with a net storage increase of 2.0 million lb. during November 1940.

There were reported stocks in addition of Imported mutton and lamb amounting to 94,449 lb.
