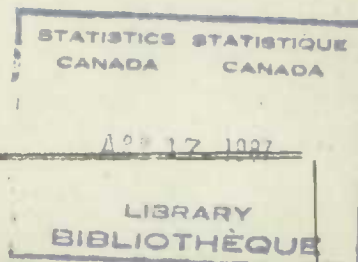

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COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF MEAT AND LARD, MARCH 1, 1942

Held by Packers, Abattoirs, Wholesale Butchers and Cold Storage Warehouses

ALL MEAT

The Grand Total stocks of all Canadian and Imported meat were 100,823,254 lb. as compared with 99,679,124 lb. at the same date last year.

The reported stocks of Canadian meat amounted to 99,607,003 lb. With an addition of 8,277,000 lb. of estimates for firms failing to report on time, there was a total of 107,884,003 lb. There was an increase of 8.5 million lb. over the total Canadian meat stocks of a year ago, while during February 1942 there was a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 13.2 million lb.

PORK

The reported holdings of Canadian pork were 67,008,820 lb. consisting of Fresh 5,293,279 lb.; Frozen 39,834,587 lb.; and Cured 21,880,954 lb. There was also an estimate of 4,835,000 lb. for late firms, which brought the Grand Total of Canadian pork to 71,843,820 lb. There was an apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 3.8 million lb. as compared with an opposite movement of 6.2 million lb. last year.

There were, in addition, reported holdings of Imported Pork amounting to 227,860 lb.

LARD

The reported holdings amounted to 6,751,011 lb. Including an estimate of 705,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time, the Grand Total amounted to 7,456,011 lb. which were 35,000 lb. greater than last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement was 652,000 lb. Last year there was a similar movement of 1.9 million lb.

BEEF

The stocks of Canadian beef were reported as 24,253,071 lb. These consisted of 6,416,734 lb. Fresh; 14,829,834 lb. Frozen; 767,310 lb. Cured and 2,239,193 lb. Fancy Meats. With an estimate of 2,785,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time there was a Grand Total of 27,038,071 lb. These stocks are 19.9 per cent less than last month and show an apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 6.7 million lb. compared with a similar movement of 2.5 million lb. a year ago. The holdings this year are 9.3 million lb. greater than last year.

In addition to the Canadian stocks there were reported holdings of Imported Beef totalling 269,033 lb.

VEAL

These stocks totalled 2,756,767 lb. as reported, being Fresh 484,346 lb. Frozen 1,961,652 lb.; and Fancy Meats 310,769 lb. Adding an estimate of 357,000 lb. for late firms, the Grand Total amounted to 3,113,767 lb. They are 34.5 per cent less than those of last month, there having been an apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.6 million lb. during February 1942 while last year there was a similar movement of 1.1 million lb. There were reported stocks in addition of Imported Veal amounting to 119,285 lb.

MUTTON AND LAMB

The holdings of Canadian mutton and lamb as reported totalled 5,588,345 lb. consisting of Fresh 229,783 lb.; Frozen 5,189,192 lb. and Fancy Meats 169,370 lb. The Grand Total was 5,888,345 lb. when 300,000 lb. were added as an estimate for firms failing to report on time.

The apparent net decrease during February was 1.1 million lb. as compared with the decrease of 1.2 million lb. during February 1941.

There were reported stocks in addition of Imported mutton and lamb amounting to 323,073 lb.
