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STOCKS OF
MEAT AND LARD
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SOURCE AND CONTENT

This report contains data on the stocks of fresh, frozen and cured meats and stocks of lard and edible tallow held by meat packers and their sales' outlets by wholesale butchers, abattoirs and cold storage warehouses. Inventories are taken only at the wholesale level. Canned meat stocks are collected by the Census of Industry and Merchandising Division of the Bureau of Statistics, the latest available information appears on page 1 of this report.

Inventory statement forms are supplied to each firm with instructions to complete and mail in time to reach the Bureau not later than the sixth of the month. Firms are required to report all stocks in their own establishment or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month. By a special arrangement, made with the industry through the Meat Packers Council of Canada, the larger meat packers report total meat inventories regardless of where held and are also permitted to submit figures of their period-end inventory providing such inventory has been taken within three days prior to the month end. Cold storage warehouses are instructed not to report stocks held for large packers.

COLD STORAGE

Total meat in cold storage at February 1, 1959 amounted to 50,750,000 lb. as compared with 52,971,000 lb. last month and 42,164,000 lb. at February 1, 1958. Current frozen holdings included 24,232,000 lb. of pork, 18,113,000 lb. of beef, 2,921,000 lb. of veal and 4,774,000 lb. of mutton and lamb. The remaining 710,000 lb. was the estimated quantity of all frozen meat held by firms whose reports were not received in time.

FRESH

Stocks of fresh meat (not Frozen) at February 1, were 21,343,000 lb. as compared with 18,328,000 lb. a month earlier and 20,993,000 lb. on February 1, 1958. The February stocks consisted of 6,621,000 lb. of pork, 13,449,000 lb. of beef, 611,000 lb. of veal and 272,000 lb. of mutton and lamb. Estimated stocks for outstanding firms amounted to 390,000 lb.

CURED AND IN CURE

Stocks of meat, cured and in cure, at February 1, were 3,875,000 lb. as compared with 9,019,000 lb. and 9,233,000 lb. last month and a year ago respectively. The current total consisted of 3,193,000 lb. of pork, 532,000 lb. of beef and an estimate of 150,000 lb. not classified as to kind.

TOTAL MEAT STOCKS

The total stocks of meat of domestic origin at February 1, 1959 amounted to 81,968,000 lb. as compared with 80,318,000 lb. last month and 72,390,000 lb. a year ago. In addition there were 3,344,000 lb. of imported meat. This total consisted of 575,000 lb. of beef, and 2,769,000 lb. of mutton and lamb. A summary of stocks at January 1, 1959 by kinds of meat will be found on page 20 of this report.

LARD and EDIBLE TALLOW

Data on stocks of these products on hand at February 1, 1959 were not available at printing time for this report.

1/ This report does not include stocks of canned meats. Stocks of these products at December 1, 1958, the latest available data, were 13,083,000 lb. of which 4,527,000 lb. were the canned pork products, 5,346,000 lb. canned beef and 3,200,000 lb. other canned meat products.
