NOTES

During the first four weeks of January 1940, Canada's ten sugar refineries manufactured 54,728,387 pounds of refined sugar, an increase of 36,153,181 pounds over the same period in 1939.

RAW SUGAR

The amount of raw sugar in the different refineries throughout Canada on January 1, 1940 was 74,526,150 pounds, while the quantity received since January 1 was 68,953,439 pounds making 143,479,589 pounds for manufacture. Meltings and sales of raw sugar account for 56,360,721 pounds leaving 87,118,868 pounds on hand at the end of the first four-week period ended January 27, 1940, compared with 76,490,666 at the same date last year. Stocks of raw sugar increased 10,628,202 over last year's figure.

REFINED SUGAR

The amount of refined sugar (cane and beet) in the refineries on January 1, 1940 was 248,461,420 pounds. The amount since manufactured into granulated sugar was 47,790,059 pounds and into yellow and brown 6,938,328 pounds totalling 54,728,387 pounds. This makes a grand total of 303,189,807 pounds. Sales for domestic consumption and for export for the above period were 99,811,661 pounds of granulated and 10,501,002 pounds of yellow and brown **accounting** for 110,312,663 pounds. The stock on hand with small amounts purchased was 192,884,644 pounds compared with 218,692,536 pounds on the same date a year ago.
