QUARTERLY TOBACCO AND TOBACCO PRODUCTS STATISTICS

This report is designed in such a way as to show the disposition of a crop of tobacco from the time that it is harvested by the growers until its final disposition by the manufacturers in the form of cigarettes, cigars, etc. It must be borne in mind that flue-cured tobacco must be subjected to an extended curing period and therefore the tobacco recorded as processed during any quarter represents a replacement of matured tobacco used in the manufacture of cigarettes, cigars, etc.

Table 1 shows the leaf tobacco production and yield. The 1967 production of flue-cured tobacco totalled 204,267 thousand pounds (green weight). Of this amount, the Ontario Flue-cured Tobacco Marketing Board records sales of 66,845 thousand pounds during the last quarter of 1967 leaving about 137,422 thousand pounds to be disposed of during the first quarter of 1968. It is highly probable that some, or all, transactions completed by "The Board" during the last days of December would not be delivered and recorded as "Purchased" by the tobacco processors until January 1968. This is confirmed by the fact that the tobacco processors recorded purchases of 139,431 thousand pounds (green weight) during the first quarter of 1968.

Table 2 shows the supply and disposition of tobacco leaf during the quarter under review by the leaf tobacco processors.

The reporting form which the processors were asked to complete is of the "Self-balancing" type and follows the formula: Opening inventories, plus production, less sales, equals closing inventories. To account for the processors interchange of tobacco we have added to the "Supply" side, the item, "Purchases from other Canadian processors" but this item is offset by the subtraction of the item, "Sales to other Canadian processors" and these two items thus become self-cancelling, however time-lag may distort this relationship.

The item "Sales to Canadian manufacturers" as recorded in this table, should correspond to the item of "Domestic purchases" as shown in Table 3. However, "Time-lag" may distort this relationship on transactions occurring at or near the end of a quarter.

Table 3 shows the supply and disposition of tobacco leaf during the quarter under review by the tobacco products manufacturers.

Here, too, the reporting forms were of the "Self-balancing" type.

In theory the imported tobacco shown in this table should correspond with the data on imports as reported in publication 65-007 "Trade of Canada" but again, time-lag may distort this relationship.

Table 4 shows the total inventories of tobacco held by both the leaf processors and the tobacco products manufacturers and includes both domestic and imported tobaccos, but excludes tobacco held in bond in Canada.

Table 5 shows the imports of tobacco into Canada as reported in Catalogue 65-007 "Trade of Canada".

Table 6 shows the export of tobacco from Canada as reported in catalogue 65-004 "Trade of Canada". In theory the exports shown in this table should correspond with exports as reported in Table 2 but, as is the case with imports, time-lag may temporarily distort this relationship.

Table 7 shows the production and disposition of tobacco products, by months and includes manufacturers inventories of finished products.
