


NOTE.- The statistics published in the present report include only the statistics of those manufacturing establishments that make biscuits, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate as their principal products. Statistics relating to specific products are, therefore, not to be regarded as comprehensive since some of the products of this industry may also be found as secondary products of the "bread and other bakery products" , "coffee, tea and spice" and "medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations" industries.

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THE BISCUIT, CONFECTIONERY, COCOA AND CHOCOLATE INDUSTRIES IN CANADA, 1931.

The output of the Biscuit, Confectionery, Cocoa and Chocolate Industry was valued at \$49,285,042 in 1931. This is a decrease of \$8,774,560 or 15 per cent as compared with the previous year. The main products of this industry were chocolate confectionery 51,277,358 pounds valued at \$13,968,632, sugar confectionery 51,327,157 pounds valued at \$9,080,205, plain and fancy biscuits 39,042 tons valued at \$10,915,432 and soda biscuits 11,975 tons valued at \$4,012,222. Compared with the previous year there was a drop in the volume of chocolate confectionery, sugar confectionery and biscuits. The output of cocoa and chocolate was, however, higher. Detailed statistics of production are given in table 5 by provinces.

The number of individual plants reporting to the Bureau in 1931 totalled 282, located by provinces as follows: Ontario 113, Quebec 60, British Columbia 48, Manitoba 19, Alberta 16, Nova Scotia 10, New Brunswick 9, Prince Edward Island 4 and Saskatchewan 3. Of the plants reporting in 1931, the number making biscuits only totalled 21, biscuits and confectionery only 16, ice cream only 18, cocoa and chocolate 5, confectionery including chewing gum 222.

As shown in table 1, the output of this industry was valued at \$49,285,042 in 1931. The 282 establishments comprising this industry reported a capital investment of \$51,530,443, they furnished employment to 12,145 persons who were paid \$10,892,636 in salaries and wages. They also paid out \$20,207,678 for materials. This industry is concentrated mainly in the province of Ontario. The 113 plants located there employed 55 per cent of the capital, produced 54 per cent of the entire output and gave employment to 48 per cent of the persons engaged in the industry.

It should be remembered that the statistics published in the present report include only the statistics of those establishments that make biscuits, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate as their principal products. Statistics relating to specific products are, therefore, not to be regarded as comprehensive, since such products as biscuits, confectionery, etc., are also found as secondary products of the following industries: bread and other bakery products, coffee, tea and spices, and medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations.

The tables that follow give detailed statistics of production, materials used, capital invested, employment, imports and exports, etc.

Owing to frequent demands for information regarding the various groups included in the Biscuit, Confectionery, Cocoa and Chocolate Industry the following table has been prepared to show the principal statistics for each group.

The principal product of each plant determines the group in which it is placed. For example, in the biscuit group there are twenty-one plants manufacturing biscuits only and sixteen plants manufacturing biscuits with confectionery as a subsidiary product. The same is true of the other groups. The firms in the confectionery group not only manufacture confectionery but also chewing gum and ice cream and in some cases small quantities of biscuits.

Size of Establishments

In view of the tendency towards concentration in industrial enterprises, a series of tables has been prepared presenting in a three-fold way the size of establishments in the Biscuit and Confectionery Industry measured by (a) capital investment, (b) gross value of production and (c) employment. The tables when compared for a number of years indicate the movement of capital, production and employment within the industry.

In 1931 the number of establishments reporting was 282 with a total capital investment of \$51,530,443, a total gross value of production of \$49,285,042, and a total employment of 12,145. Of the total number of establishments thirteen had a capital investment of \$30,828,476 or 59.8 per cent of the total investment with an average investment of \$2,371,421. In gross value of production fourteen establishments had a total production of \$26,772,840 or 54.3 per cent of the total for the industry and an average production of \$1,912,345 per establishment. In employment sixteen establishments had a total payroll of 6,677 or 55 per cent of the number employed, and an average employment of 417 per establishment.
