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#### THE BISCUIT, CONFECTIONERY, COCOA AND CHOCOLATE INDUSTRIES IN CANADA, 1933.

The output of the biscuit, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate industry was valued at \$35,176,094, a decrease of 5.9 per cent as compared with that of the previous year. The 236 establishments comprising this industry reported a capital investment of \$41,410,901, they furnished employment to 9,891 persons who were paid \$8,114,234 in salaries and wages, and they also paid out \$15,725,547 for materials. The trend of production still continued downward in 1933. Compared with 1932 there was a decrease of \$2,209,999 in the value of production, \$3,991,985 in the capital invested, 635 in the number of persons employed and \$1,311,264 in the salaries and wages paid. There was, however, a small increase of \$130,853 in the value of materials used.

The number of individual plants reporting to the Bureau in 1933 totalled 236, located by provinces as follows: Ontario 97, Quebec 49, British Columbia 41, Manitoba 19, Alberta 10, Nova Scotia 8, New Brunswick 7, Prince Edward Island 3 and Saskatchewan 2. The number making biscuits only totalled 24, biscuits and confectionery 10, cocoa and chocolate 4 and confectionery, including chewing gum 198.

The main products of the industry in 1933 were: chocolate confectionery (in dozen bars) 14,792,345 valued at \$4,459,777, in bulk and packages 19,096,016 pounds valued at \$4,941,769; sugar confectionery in bulk and packages 43,922,846 pounds valued at \$6,298,450, in dozen bars 1,378,893 valued at \$551,416; biscuits, plain and fancy, 29,466 tons valued at \$7,512,883; soda biscuits 11,977 tons valued at \$3,590,684; cocoa for sale 4,364,853 pounds valued at \$921,632; chocolate and chocolate coatings 8,165,527 pounds valued at \$1,532,162 and ice cream 787,888 gallons valued at \$1,012,456.

This industry is concentrated mainly in the province of Ontario. The 97 plants located there employed 59 per cent of the capital, produced 55 per cent of the entire output and gave employment to 49 per cent of the persons engaged in the industry.

It should be remembered that the statistics published in the present report include only the statistics of those establishments that make biscuits, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate as their principal products. Statistics relating to specific products are, therefore, not to be regarded as comprehensive, since such products as biscuits, confectionery, etc., are also found as secondary products of the following industries: bread and other bakery products, coffee, tea and spices and medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations.

The tables that follow give detailed statistics of production, materials used, capital invested, employment, imports and exports, etc.

Owing to frequent demands for information regarding the various groups included in the biscuit, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate industry the following table has been prepared to show the principal statistics for each group.

The principal product of each plant determines the group in which it is placed. For example, in the biscuit group there are 24 plants manufacturing biscuits only and 10 plants manufacturing biscuits with confectionery as a subsidiary product. The same is true of the other groups. The firms in the confectionery group not only manufacture confectionery but also chewing gum and ice cream and in some cases small quantities of biscuits.

#### Size of Establishments

In view of the tendency towards concentration in industrial enterprises, a series of tables has been prepared presenting in a threefold way the size of establishments in the biscuit, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate industry measured by (a) capital investment, (b) gross value of production and (c) employment. The tables when compared for a number of years indicate the movement of capital, production and employment within the industry.

In 1933 the number of establishments reporting was 236 with a total capital investment of \$41,410,901, a total gross value of production of \$35,176,094 and a total employment of 9,891. Of the total number of establishments fourteen had a capital investment of \$27,288,297 or 65.8 per cent of the total investment, with an average investment of \$1,949,164 per establishment. In gross value of production eleven establishments had a total output of \$17,640,561 or 50.1 per cent of the total for the industry and an average production of \$1,603,687 per establishment. In employment fifteen establishments had a payroll of 5,483 or 55.2 per cent of the number employed, and an average employment of 366 per establishment.

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


