NOTE: - The statistics published in the present report include only the statistics of those manufacturing establishments that make biscuits, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate as their principal products. Statistics relating to specific products are, therefore not to be regarded as the total for Canada since some of the products of this industry may also be found as secondary products of the "bread and other bakery products", "coffee, tea, spice and miscellaneous foods" and "medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations" industries.

THE BISCUIT, CONFECTIONERY, COCOA AND CHOCOLATE INDUSTRIES IN CANADA, 1935.

The output of the biscuit, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate industries in 1935 was valued at \$41,180,949, an increase of 3 per cent as compared with that of the previous year. The 234 establishments comprising this industry reported a capital investment of \$37,779,319, they furnished employment to 10,446 persons who were paid \$9,315,563 in salaries and wages, and also paid out \$19,231,189 for materials. The trend of production in the biscuit and confectionery industries still continues upward. The value of production, the number of persons employed and the salaries and wages paid were higher than the corresponding figure for the previous year. The value of production was \$1,104,032 higher. There was also an increase of \$973,998 in the cost of materials used; the number of employees increased by 142 and the salaries and wages paid by \$452,629.

The number of individual plants reporting to the Bureau in 1935 totalled 234, located by provinces as follows: Ontario 92, Quebec 52, British Columbia 35, Manitoba 21, Saskatchewan and Alberta 16, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island 11 and New Brunswick 7. The number making biscuits only totalled 21, biscuits and confectionery 14, cocoa and chocolate 4, confectionery, including chewing gum, 195.

The main products of the industry in 1935 were: chocolate confectionery, in bulk, 20,762,254 pounds valued at \$3,743,154; chocolate confectionery, in dozen bars, 17,142,334 valued at \$5,834,873; chocolate confectionery, in packages, 7,617,258 pounds valued at \$2,407,762, sugar confectionery, in bulk, 44,271,215 pounds valued at \$5,788,807. Biscuits, plain and fancy, 36,017 tons valued at \$8,700,098 and biscuits, soda, 12,411 tons valued at \$3,445,752. Detailed statistics of production are given in table 5.

This industry is concentrated mainly in the province of Ontario, the 92 plants located there employed 60 per cent of the capital, they produced 57 per cent of the entire output and gave employment to 50 per cent of the persons engaged in the industry.

It should be remembered that the statistics published in the present report include only the statistics of those establishments that make biscuits, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate as their principal products. Statistics relating to specific products are, therefore, not to be regarded as comprehensive, since such products as biscuits, confectionery, etc., are also found as secondary products of the following industries: bread and other bakery products, coffee, tea and spices and medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations.

The tables that follow give detailed statistics of production, materials used, capital invested, employment, imports and exports, etc.

Owing to frequent demands for information regarding the various groups included in the biscuit, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate industry, the following table has been prepared to show the principal statistics for each group.

The principal product of each plant determines the group in which it is placed. For example, in the biscuit group there are twenty—one plants manufacturing biscuits only and fourteen plants manufacturing biscuits with confectionery as a subsidiary product. The same is true of the other groups. The firms in the confectionery group not only manufacture confectionery, but also chewing gum and ice cream and in some cases small quantities of biscuits.

Size of Establishments

In view of the tendency towards concentration in industrial enterprise, a series of tables has been prepared presenting in a threefold way the size of establishments in the biscuit, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate industry, measured by (a) capital investment, (b) gross value of production and (c) employment. The tables when compared for a number of years indicate the movement of capital, production and employment within the industry

investment of \$37,779,519, a total gross value of production of \$41,180,949 and a total employment of 10,446. Of the total number of establishments, twelve had a capital investment of \$23,921,933 or 63.3 per cent of the total investment, with an average investment of \$1,840,148 per establishment. In gross value of production, thirteen establishments had a total output of \$22,450,242 or 54.3 per cent of the total for the industry and an average production of \$1,870,853 per establishment. In employment, fourteen establishments had a payroll of 5,578 or 53.4 per cent of the number employed, and an average amployment of 398 per establishment.


