THE BISCUIT, CONFECTIONERY, COCOA AND CHOCOLATE INDUSTRIES IN CANADA, 1936.

The output of the biscuit, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate industries in 1936 was valued at \$46,051,641, an increase of 11.8 per cent as compared with that of the previous year. The 206 establishments comprising this industry reported a capital investment of \$39,802,756, they furnished employment to 11,199 persons who were paid \$10,101,275 in salaries and wages, and also paid out \$22,191,155 for materials. The trend of production in the biscuit and confectionery industries still continues upward. The value of production, the number of persons employed and the salaries and wages paid were higher than the corresponding figure of the previous year. The value of production was \$4,853,808 higher. There was also an increase of \$2,959,966 in the cost of materials used; the number of employees increased by 753 and the salaries and wages paid by \$785,712.

The number of individual plants reporting to the Bureau in 1936 totalled 206, a decrease of 28 firms, due to 16 firms going out of business and the other 12 not reporting. As the production of the latter firms was less than \$10,000 their exclusion does not affect the total value of production. The location of plants by provinces was as follows: Ontario 85, Quebec 48, British Columbia 30, Manitoba 16, Saskatchewan and Alberta 13, Nova Scotia 8, and New Brunswick 6.

The main products of the industry in 1936 were: chocolate confectionery, in bulk, 26,753,612 pounds valued at \$5,103,503; chocolate confectionery, in dozen bars, 15,186,287 valued at \$5,572,889; chocolate confectionery in packages, 7,845,545 pounds valued at \$2,615,136; sugar confectionery, in bulk, 39,546,913 pounds valued at \$5,093,797. Biscuits, plain and fancy, 37,376 tons valued at \$9,427,059 and biscuits soda, 12,984 tons valued at \$3,774,599. Detailed statistics of production are given in table 5.

This industry is concentrated mainly in the province of Ontario, the 85 plants located there employed 60 per cent of the capital, they produced 57 per cent of the entire output and gave employment to 51 per cent of the persons engaged in the industry.

It should be remembered that the statistics published in the present report include only the statistics of those establishments that make biscuits, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate as their principal products. Statistics relating to specific products are, therefore, not to be regarded as the total for Canada, since such products as biscuits, confectionery, etc., are also found as secondary products of the following industries: bread and other bakery products, coffee, tea, and spices and medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations.

The tables that follow give detailed statistics of production, materials used, capital invested, employment, imports and exports, etc.

Owing to frequent demands for information regarding the various groups included in the biscuit, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate industry, the following table has been prepared to show the principal statistics for each group.

The principal product of each plant determines the group in which it is placed. For example, in the biscuit group there are twenty-two plants manufacturing biscuits only and twelve plants manufacturing biscuits with confectionery as a subsidiary product. The same is true of the other groups. The firms in the confectionery group not only manufacture confectionery, but also chewing gum and ice cream and in some cases small quantities of biscuits.

Size of Establishments

In view of the tendency towards concentration in industrial enterprise, a series of tables has been prepared presenting in a threefold way the size of establishments in the biscuit, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate industry, measured by (a) capital investment, (b) gross value of production and (c) employment. The tables when compared for a number of years indicate the movement of capital, production and employment within the industry.

In 1936 the number of establishments reporting was 206 with a total capital investment of \$39,802,756, a total gross value of production of \$46,051,641, and a total employment of 11,199. Of the total number of establishments fourteen had a capital investment of \$26,077,167 or 65.5 per cent of the total investment, with an average investment of \$1,862,654 per establishment. In gross value of production, thirteen establishments had a total output of \$26,367,875 or 57.2 per cent of the total for the industry and an average production of \$2,028,298 per establishment. In employment, fourteen establishments had a payroll of 6,064 or 54.1 per cent of the number employed, and an average employment of 433 per establishment.




