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# THE BISCUIT, CONFECTIONERY, COCOA AND CHOCOLATE INDUSTRIES <br> IN CANADA, 1937. 

The output of the biscuit, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate industries in 1937 was valued at $\$ 49,475,403$, an increase of 704 per cent as compared with that of the previous year. The 223 establishments comprising this industry reported a capital investment of $\$ 38,565,652$, they furnished employment to 11,879 persons, who were paid $\$ 10,892,004$ in salaries and wages, and also paid out $\$ 24,351,815$ for materials. The trend of production in the biscuit and confectionery industries still continues upward. The value of production, the number of persons employed and the salaries and wages paid were higher than the corresponding figure for the previous year. The value of production was $\$ 3,423,762$ bigher. There was also an increase of $\$ 2,160,660$ in the cost of materials used; the number of employees increased by 678 and the salaries and wages paid by $\$ 790,729$.

The number of individual plants reporting to the Bureau in 1937 totalled 223, an increase of 17 firms. The location of plants by provinces was as follows: Ontario, 88; Quebec, 52; British Columbia, 31; Manitoba, 20; Saskatchewan and Alberta, 13; Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, 12; and New Brunswick, 7.

The main products of the industry in 1937 were: chocolate confectionery in bulk, $26,081,561$ pounds valued at $\$ 5,315,028$; chocolate confectionery in dozen bars, $16,398,788$ valued at $\$ 6,277,799$; chocolate confectionery in packages $8,979,006$ pounds valued at $\$ 2,110,435$; sugar confectionery in bulk, $43,182,598$ pounds valued at $\$ 5,820,884$. Biscuits, plain and fancy, 41,254 tons valued at $\$ 10,065,607$, and biscuits, soda, 13,130 tons valued at $\$ 4,038,058$. Detailed statistics of production are given in table 5 .

This industry is concentrated mainly in the province of Untario. The 88 plants located there employed 58 per cent of the capital. They produced 56 per cent of the entire output and gave employment to 51 per cent of the persons engaged in the industry.

It should be remembered that the statistics published in the present report include only the statistics of those establishments that make biscuits, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate as their principal products. Statistics relating to specific products are, therefore, not to be regarded as the total for Canada, since such products as biscuits, confectionery, etc., are also found as secondary products of the following industries: bread and other bakery products; coffee, tea and spices and medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations.

The tables that follow give deteiled statistics of production, materials used, capital invested, employment, imports and exports, etc.

Owing to frequent demands for information regarding the various groups included in the biscuit, confectionery, cocos and chocolate industry, the following table has been prepared to show the principal statistics for each group.

The principal product of each plant determines the group in which it is placed. For example, in the biscuit group there are twenty-three plants manufacturing biscuits only and thirteen plants manufacturimg biscuits with confectionery as a subsidiary product. The same is true of the other groups. The firms in the confectionery group not only manufacture confectionery, but also chering gum and ice cream and in some cases small quantities of biscuits.

## Size of Establishments

In view of the tendency towards concentration in industrial enterprise, a series of tables has been prepared representing in a three fold way the size of establishments in the biscuit, confectionery, cocoa and chocolate industry, measured by (a) capital investment, (b) gross value of production and (c) employment. The tables when compared for number of years indicate the movement of capital, production and employment within the industry.

In 1937 the number of establishments reporting was 223 with a total capital investrent of $\$ 38,565,652$, a total gross value of production of $\$ 49,475,403$, and a total employment of 11,879 。 Of the total number of establishments twelve had a capital investment of $\$ 23,089,134$ or 59.8 per cent of the total investment, with an average investment of $\$ 1,924,094$ yer establishment. In gross value of production fourteen establishments had a total outpat of $\$ 28,521,770$ or 57,6 per cent of the total for the industry and an average production of \$2,027,259 per establishment. In employment, thirteen establishments had a payroll of 6,121 or 51.5 per oent of the number emplayed, and an average employment of 471 per establishment.
