

## THE PREPARED BREAKFAST FOODS AND OTHER CEREAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1936.

A report on the prepared breakfast foods and other cereal products industry in Canada is herewith presented for the year 1936. Prior to 1930 producers of breakfast foods and other cereal products were included with the miscellaneous food industry. It should be remembered that the statistics published in the present report refer only to firms whose principal products are breakfast foods and other cereal products. These products are also made in the flour milling industry which is covered by a separate report.

Production in this industry in 1936 included 65,679,133 pounds of prepared breakfast foods (corn flakes, bran flakes, wheat flakes, shredded wheat, muffets, force, etc.), valued at \$9,457,130, unprepared cereal products \$630,884 and all other products \$678,619. The total output of "prepared breakfast foods" in 1936 (including those produced in the flour milling industry), was 76,355,140 pounds valued at \$10,766,370 (see footnote to table 2). Such unprepared cereals as oatmeal, rolled oats, etc., which are produced exclusively in the flour milling industry are not included in this report.

According to table 1, firms whose principal products were prepared breakfast foods and other cereal products numbered twenty-eight in 1936. Of these sixteen were located in Ontario, three in Manitoba, two in Saskatchewan, two in Alberta and five in British Columbia. These firms reported a capital investment of \$5,006,372; they furnished employment to 702 persons who were paid \$822,390 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$3,642,775 for materials, and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$10,766,633. This industry is practically confined to the Province of Ontario.

Compared with the previous year there were increases of 5 in the number of establishments, \$1,111,584 in the value of production, \$338,070 in the cost of materials used, 60 in the number of employees, and \$75,753 in the amount paid out in salaries and wages. The capital investment, however, declined to the extent of \$113,448.

Exports of cereal foods are considerable. In 1936 they amounted to \$4,204,738. Imports, however, are much smaller, amounting to only \$175,886 in 1936.

#### Size of Establishments

A series of tables is presented showing in a threefold way the size of establishments in the industry, measured by (a) gross value of production, (b) capital investment and (c) employment. The tables when compared for a number of years indicate the movement of production, capital and employment within the industry.

Of the twenty-eight establishments reporting in 1936, five had a total production of \$10,285,249, or almost 96 per cent of the total for the industry, and an average production of \$2,057,050 per establishment. In capital investment, four establishments had a capital investment of \$4,328,671 or over 86 per cent of the total investment, with an average investment of \$1,082,168 per establishment. In employment, five establishments had a total payroll of 590 or over 84 per cent of the total employed, and an average employment of 118 per establishment.




